Greater Jackson Habitat & the City of Jackson Partner Together to Address Jackson's **Affordable Housing Crisis**

The City of Jackson and Greater Jackson Habitat for Humanity have partnered together to provide more affordable housing for Jackson residents. DeLand Pointe will be Greater Jackson Habitat's first neighborhood development. Located just south of downtown Jackson, DeLand Pointe will be the home to six families in Habitat's Homebuver Program. The neighborhood will consist of six two-story homes adjacent to the new Jackson YMCA on

the corners of W. Franklin Street, S. Mechanic Street. and W. Mason Street. Each family matched with a home will have completed federally certified financounseling cial and 300 hours of sweat equity and will have estab-

lished the means to purchase the home.

With this being a historic project, Greater Jackson Habitat has invited sponsors, companies, and volunteers from around the city to participate in a week-long Blitz Build to raise and enclose the first two houses. The event will kick off on August 16th, 2021, with a First Responders Day. Jackson City Police, Fire, Michigan State Police, and Henry Ford Allegiance Health staff will be charged with framing the 1st floors and preparing the construction of the 2nd floors. Other participating companies during the week include CertainTeed, Gerdau, and Jackson Area Association of





Meeting the Need: Birth Brite Foster Closet

Birth Brite Foster Closet is meeting a need that many people don't know exist. Foster closet is a new phrase for many. People often hear "foster closet" and immediately think that we lend out items to someone in need. Serving those in need is right, but the lending part is so far from the truth. Everything that we supply to foster children and families is theirs to keep.

Birth Brite is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit in Jackson County. Birth Brite Foster Closet was specifically created to meet the immediate clothing and basic care needs for children in foster care. Our organization is committed to providing new and like- new items that have been donated to us. Current and stylish clothing. new underwear, toiletries, diapers, car seats, comfort care blankets and other essential items, are just some of the items we supply. Children often enter into foster care with very little or no personal items, and

into the foster care system with only the clothes on their backs.

For the month of May in Jackson County there were 201 children in foster care, 404 complaints to centralized intake, 161 investigations, and 77 families in ongoing intervention to prevent removal. Birth Brite is here to serves families who are touched by foster care. There are lots of amazing community resources and more established organizations that are looking out for the best interest of local children, so you might ponder, why add one more? Our approach and perspective on how we can best serve is a little different from other organizations, which allows us to provide immediate assistance, without long complicated procedures.

The sisters behind the closet were both licensed foster parents in Jackson County. We are able to look at the needs of the foster community from the ground level. It's our own personal experiences and involve-

in many cases, they come ment with youth in foster care that has driven us to take action. There are so many families that foster for less than a year due to lack of support. So much time and energy is put into becoming a licensed foster family. Families welcome a child into their home and work each day to meet that child's individual needs. Birth Brite's aim is to come alongside foster families as a resource and a show of community support. We want children and families to know, they are not alone on this journey.

Birth Brite is committed to all parties touched by foster care. The children, the parents, licensed foster parents, kinship/relative caregivers, and youth aging out of system. We provide items and support through Birth Brite Foster Closet and during special events. Supplying access to these items helps families reduce financial expenses and provides the opportunity to get much needed items to assist in taking care of the youth in their home. In addition, we also provide support to youth in foster care by ensuring their birthday is celebrated. The gift itself provides the opportunity for a positive birthday experience and more importantly it reaffirms that they are valued, worthy and cared for.

and Trails (abbreviated to PPT) was recently founded by two City of Jackson employees. The goal of PPT is to provide a volunteer group for the city's parks to do regular trash cleanups, landscaping, and light main-

"We have the parks, and now we just need the people to power this program!" said Aaron Dimick, a Jackson resident and the city's Public Information Officer. Dimick and Andrew Sargeant, Assistant Director of the Parks

and Recreation Department, created PPT earlier this summer after discussing the need for a resident-based group that supports parks and trails. "After riding my bike down the MLK Equality who want Trail and seeing lots of litter. I thought it would be great to get together with other Jackson residents to do work in parks that our staff don't always have time for," Dimick

The City of Jackson has 28 public parks and an expanding network of pedestrian trails. While improvements continue to maintain this high level of service and meet new community needs, the city is left with fewer financial resources and staff to support the parks system. "We have some groups we work with from local businesses and organizations who volunteer in parks, but we really need a regular support base to keep up with a variety

of maintenance projects," Sargeant said.

Dimick, who is helping organize PPT as a resident outside of work time, says park and trail access is a big contributor to Jackson's quality of life. "I invite all City of Jackson residents to join People for the Parks! Coming together to uplift our parks will help maintain this excellent service, enhance quality of life for our neighbors, and cultivate lots of community pride," Dimick our department."





I have not been convicted of a felony, significant misdemeanor, or three or more other misdemeanors in the categories which would have disqualified me for DACA, and do not otherwise pose a threat to national security or public safety

- I am currently in high school or graduated from a United States high school or obtained a GED (General Education Development) certificate from a United **States Program**
- · I am willing to apply to or attend one of the Golden Door Scholars Partner Schools.
- I am willing to explore and apply for other scholarships in addition to the Golden Door Scholarship.

Scholarship recipients will receive funding for a fouryear degree at Golden Door partner schools beginning Fall semester, 2022. Students who have applied to or are interested in other colleges should also apply. We will support students at non-partner schools on a case-by-case basis.

Imagine Planet has lots of astronomy and space activities to explore, so come check them out.




