

of fuzzy socks they do not yet own from Lowry's Little Flock Farm. Whoever you are shopping for this season, you can find something for them locally!



in Betsy Butterfield Park, Elnora Moorman Plaza, Ganson Street Park, Austin Blair Park, and Kiwanis Park.


Volunteers installed lights with the Parks and Recreation Department's permission throughout November, with the displays turning on after Thanksgiving Day. PPT collaborated with the Kiwanis Club of Jackson to put up lights and holiday decor at Kiwanis Park off N. Elm Avenue.

The non-profit is focused on improving Jackson's parks and trails through volunteering, fundraising, and advocacy. 2022 was a busy year for People for the Parks and Trails, with the group completing volunteer projects at seven

parks, two pedestrian trails, and one cemetery. PPT also donated two new trash cans to the City's MLK Equality Trail to help reduce litter and pet waste along the trail.

Volunteers expanded the number of light projects they did this year after lighting up two parks last year. A Christmas in July fundraiser was held this summer so PPT could purchase lights and accessories for the parks. "We thank everyone who has helped make such a positive project happen for the community," said PPT President Aaron Dimick. "These lights add a lot of holiday cheer to our neighborhoods and shows everyone that Jackson is a welcoming community that cares about our public spaces."

People for the Parks and Trails plan on leaving the lights on through the first week of Jan. Residents wanting to get involved with volunteer projects can submit an interest form through PPT's website, peoplefortheparks.org. Donations are also accepted through the website to support volunteer work. The group is active on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter and regularly posts updates on group activities.

Empty Boxes

Have you ever heard someone say their kids enjoyed playing with a box and wondered why? How? Often as we grow, our imagination seems to shrink. A box, to many adults, is to be broken down, thrown away, burned, used to store items in, or to move items from place to place. These are all very practical uses for a box, but an object that appears as a functional tool to an adult can appear as a wonderous thing to a child.

Children still have lovely imaginations, especially when they're encouraged. A box can be a castle, a race car, a rocket ship, a magic portal, a television, or a secret clubhouse. As you can guess, the list goes on and on. You can paint on a box, draw on a box, cut holes in a box, tape boxes together, poke holes in a box, or glue items onto a box.

While a child may be having fun with the boxes, many important processes are happening simultane-



Minority Scholarship in Classics and Classical Archaeology

Eligibility:

The Committee on Diversity in the Profession of the Society for Classical Studies (SCS) invites applications from minority undergraduate students from across North America for a

scholarship to be awarded for Summer 2023. The purpose of the scholarship is to further students' study of classics or classical archaeology with opportunities not available during the school year.

Eligible proposals might include, but are not limited to, participation in classical summer programs or field schools in the Mediterranean or language training at institutions in the U.S., Canada, or Europe.

Candidates will be judged on the basis of:

- Their academic qualifications, including demonstrated ability in fields that prepare a student for further study in Classics or archaeology
- The quality of their proposal
- Demonstration of financial need.

- A letter describing your career goals and plans for summer 2023, with a prioritized list of programs to which you will apply. How would the proposed program help you achieve your future goals? Examples include, but are not limited to, completing a major or minor in Classics; preparing for post-baccalaureate work or graduate study; preparing to teach at the K-12 level or to enter a profession related to Classics or archaeology in, for example, museums, libraries, or publishing
- The application must be supported by two letters of recommendation. At least one letter of recommendation must include a statement indicating that this is an appropriate candidate for the purposes of this scholarship.
- One page summary of the projected or actual budget


