

At Cascades Humane Society (CHS), every day is an opportunity to make a difference. From healing injured animals to finding loving homes for those in need, the work we do is only possible because of the incredible generosity of our community.

Stories of Hope and Healing

The animals who come through our doors often face incredible challenges. but thanks to our dedicated team and supporters like you, they find a second chance.

Biscuit's Journey to Recovery

Biscuit, a friendly cat initially brought to us as part of a Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program. Upon examination, Biscuit was found to have severely infected ears due to irreversible cauliflower contracture. This deformity, caused by scar tissue, had completely closed his ear canals, preventing proper healing. Our medical team performed a bilateral complete pinnectomy to open his ears and clear the infection. After the successful surgery, Biscuit was quickly adopted and is now living his best life with a loving family.

String's Remarkable **Transformation**

Another one of the many lives transformed at Cascades Humane Society is that of String, an eightweek-old black and white domestic shorthair kitten.

Now renamed Rome, this resilient kitten is thriving in his forever home with his former foster mom, a "foster fail," as we affectionately call these successful adoptions here at CHS.

Bruce's Unbreakable Spirit

Three-year-old Bruce was brought in by his owner to be euthanized after exhausting their financial resources at another clinic. where he had been catheterized due to bladder stones. Rather than giving up on Bruce, we offered to perform the bladder stone removal surgery at a reduced cost. Unfortunately, after surgery, Bruce developed a life-threatening condition that caused his blood to clot excessively, followed by uncontrollable bleeding. Our staff worked tirelessly around the clock to stabilize him. Further tests revealed Bruce was also suffering from severe liver disease and sepsis. Despite his grim prognosis, Bruce's spirit never faltered, and his owners, unable to continue his care, surrendered him to CHS. Against all odds, Bruce has made a remarkable recovery and is living his best life with a foster family who have become his forever family in another "foster fail."

The availability date is when the dog becomes JCAS property; however, any necessary medical procedures may cause a slight delay in the adoption process. A manda-

tory meet & greet with your dog is essential. A cat room walk-through is available to test reactions. Dogs will be placed with approved applicants, and the adoption fee is \$150 for medium/large dogs and \$250 for puppies/ small dogs, which includes vaccinations, microchip, and sterilization.



Ahsoka & Licorice

Ahsoka and Licorice are a pair of two-year-old cats who were surrendered together due to their previous owner's allergies. Each weighing about 10 pounds, these lovely ladies have unique personalities. Ahsoka, the friendly tuxedo cat, adores being petted and will quickly win you over with her affectionate nature. Licorice, a stunning black cat with a sleek, shiny coat, enjoys being held like a baby. While

she may be shy around strangers at first, she warms up once she feels safe. Ideally, these two could be adopted together, but they also get along well with other cats in their current environment. Join me and my family as we explore Hometown Eats across Jackson County. If



the kitchen is the heart of the home, are small, locally owned restaurants the heart of our hometown? I will provide real reviews of Jackson's local restaurants, everything from dive bars to cloth napkin restaurants. I hope you

enjoy our culinary experiences and that they inspire you to try new restaurants.

To start off the New Year and my new series, I stuck close to home and tried Brooklyn's newest restaurant, Atlas. Atlas is located at 123 North Main Street, Brooklyn. They have been open for a few months, and from what I have experienced, they will be open for years to come. Located right on Main Street, don't be alarmed when you can't find parking on the square; there is ample parking behind the restaurant. However, there aren't any signs (yet).

From the moment you look into the restaurant through the large, beautiful windows, you will be immersed in the atmosphere. The open concept is kept quaint through bold colors and fabrics. We were immediately greeted by friendly staff and shown to a table. We didn't make a reservation although they do accept them. Friendly staff were a key component of our visit, from our server, the bartender, and the other staff who jumped in to remove our dirty plates throughout our experience. Although we were there for lunch, we decided to treat ourselves as if it was New

Year's Day and have appetizers. Do yourself a favor, show up hungry, and get an appetizer or two to share. I highly recommend the whipped ricotta and the Greek mezza board. Both are more than enough food for yourself and others if you choose to share. Lunch was as delicious as our appetizers'. Our table enjoyed the Caprese Grilled Cheese, Chicken Tikka Masala, and the Ahi Tuna Poke Bowl. From the first sight of our food, we knew it would be delicious as you eat first with your eyes. Everything was fresh, homemade, and delicious. except for the homemade chips. I have to be honest: they were bland, tasted like oil, and didn't do anything to enhance my lunch experience. Their ketchup, however, is wonderful! I ended up ordering fries so I could enjoy the ketchup. While this restaurant is a 2 \$\$ restaurant, the portions are perfect, and since we ordered appetizers, we each took home a bit of lunch for another day. Dessert was, sadly, another disappointment. We ordered a piece of chocolate cake and crème brulee. While the piece of chocolate cake was more like a guarter of a cake, both desserts were very lackluster and ended up unfinished and left at the restaurant. Save yourself a few dollars and calories and skip dessert.

It's wonderful to see new businesses come into our area, and it's even better to see them succeed. Although the restaurant wasn't full, it had a very diverse group of people. This speaks volumes about its welcoming atmosphere and varied menu, with a wide range of dishes for vegetarians, vegans, and carnivores alike.

I give this restaurant 4.5 out of 5 stars.



- Essays must have a minimum of five sources.
- Essays about past recipients of the Profile in Courage Award will be disqualified unless they describe an act of political courage other than the act for which the award was given.

Award: \$10,000 First Prize. Cash awards for the top 15 essays.

Independent Hardee's Franchisee Association Scholarship

Description: The Independent Hardee's Franchisee Association (IHFA) has established a scholarship program to assist employees who plan to continue their education in college or vocational school programs. Scholarships are offered each year for full-time study at an accredited institution of the student's choice.

Minority Scholarship in Classics and Classical Archaeology

Description: The Society for Classical Studies (SCS) invites undergraduate students from historically underrepresented groups in North America to apply for scholarships for Summer 2025. These scholarships support students' study of classics or classical archaeology through opportunities such as summer programs, field schools, or language training. Proposals can also include public engagement projects through the Ancient World, Modern Communities program. Since 1994, the SCS has awarded the Minority Scholarship in Classics and Classical Archaeology, offering at least two scholarships annually since

2010.

Requirements:

- A letter describing your career goals and plans for summer 2025, with a prioritized list of programs to which you will apply. How would the proposed program help you achieve your future goals? Examples include, but are not limited to, completing a major or minor in Classics; preparing for post-baccalaureate work or graduate study; preparing to teach at the K-12 level or to enter a profession related to Classics or archaeology in, for example, museums, libraries, or publishing
- The application must be supported by two letters of recommendation. At least one letter of recommendation must include a statement indicating that this is an appropriate candidate for the purposes of this scholarship.
- One page summary of the projected or actual budget
 - An official transcript

Eligibility: Those eligible are members of historically underrepresented ethnic and racial groups in the United States and Canada, for example, students who are of African descent, Latinx, Asian or Asian American, Pacific Islander, and of indigenous descent (Native American, Inuit, Canadian First Peoples.)


Candidates will be judged on the basis of:

- Their academic qualifications, including demonstrated ability in fields that prepare a student for further study in Classics or archaeology
- The quality of their proposal
- Demonstration of financial need

Award: a maximum award of \$4,500

Deadline: January 20, 2025 at 11:59 p.m. (EST)
