Exciting Progress Unfolds at Jackson YMCA Construction Site

In the heart of Jackson, a flurry of activity surrounds the construction site of the Jackson YMCA, where significant progress is evident in this ambitious project. With each passing day, the vision for a revitalized facility that better serves the community edges closer to reality.

While much of the ongoing work remains concealed from view, the unmistakable sounds of progress resonate throughout the building. The removal of concrete walls and staircases, though not visible to guests, signifies significant strides in the renovation process.

One of the most noticeable changes has been to the front facade, where it has undergone a remarkable transformation. The removal of windows and structural elements marks the beginning of the evolution towards the new architectural design.

Additionally, work on the parking lot side of the building has been underway. Bailey Excavating has been hard at work removing asphalt in preparation for the foundation work of the new addition. Crews have been busy removing the remainder of the black fencing around the parking lot. While this work progresses, leadership emphasizes the importance of safety and asks that visitors note that the remaining chain-link fence encompasses the construction work area and is clearly marked for no entry. Even if the gates are open, this area is not for public use. As with all construction sites, safety is the top priority, and cooperation

in respecting the boundaries of the construction zone is requested.

Furthermore, the construction team is proud to announce several key milestones:

- A new sewer line has been initiated and is set to be ready for switch-over by Thursday of next week.

- The crane necessary for various construction tasks has been delivered and will be up and running by March 5.

- Asbestos abatement in the former boys' and girls' locker rooms has been successfully completed and has passed testing, ensuring the safety of all occupants.

- Electricians have begun the installation of new lines for future RTUs (Roof-Top Units), laying the groundwork for enhanced heating and ventilation systems.

- The boiler in the basement has been successfully removed, with the storage tank slated for removal by March 7.

- Rebar installation on the north face for new concrete has been completed, marking progress towards structural enhancements.

Please remember to utilize available parking in the YMCA lot off Franklin Street and the City lot on Wesley Street. Additionally, be mindful of the 2-hour parking limit enforced on Franklin Street and refrain from parking in neighboring lots out of respect for local businesses.

As the Jackson YMCA project progresses, the community eagerly anticipates the completion of this transformative endeavor, poised to redefine health and wellness in the heart of Jackson.

Dog adoptions require an application, which you can find online here. The availability date is when the dog becomes JCAS property; however, any necessary medical procedures may cause a slight delay in the adoption process. A manda-

tory meet & greet with your dog is essential. A cat room walk-through is available to test reactions. Dogs will be placed with approved applicants, and the adoption fee is \$150 for medium/large dogs and \$250 for puppies/small dogs, which includes vaccinations, microchip, and sterilization.

Up and Away: Keep Your Children Safe Around Medication

How often do children inadvertently get into medication? Each year, around 35,000 children access medication and are hospitalized. Children are curious and, while exploring, tend to try to put everything in their mouths. It's essential for your children's safety that medications are stored safely and correctly to avoid any mishaps. It is also essential to seek treatment should children get into any medications, as the effects may be severe.

Keeping medications out of reach and out of

sight of children can significantly reduce adverse outcomes. One way to achieve this is by utilizing a lockbox. If this is not accessible to you at the moment, consider moving medication to hard-to-reach areas such as high shelves in secure cabinets. Another precaution that should be taken is to ensure that medications are put away directly after use, including daily medications. When medications are put away, double-check that the safety caps are entirely on and secured. When inspecting the safety cap, confirm it has clicked, indicating that it is locked in place. It is also a good idea to speak to houseguests about safe

medication storage practices by asking them to keep their personal belongings that contain medications (e.g., coats, purses, etc.) out of reach.

Even if a medication has a safety lock, children may be able to get into it. If a child does manage to get their hands on medications, immediate action must be taken. You should call poison control at 800-222-1222. Having this number preprogrammed into your phone may save you added stress should you need to utilize it. You should also seek medical treatment through your primary care physician, if available, or visit the nearest emergency room.

Join Imagine Planet for the Great American Total Eclipse

An excerpt from a previous newsletter from July of 2017:

“The big event in science this summer is the All-American Total Eclipse of the Sun on August 21st. This will be visible all over the United States although here in Michigan we will be seeing a partial eclipse. Solar eclipses occur when the Moon lines up perfectly between the Sun and the Earth and blocks the Sun’s light from reaching Earth (it casts a shadow). At Imagine Planet we will have information about how to view a solar eclipse (NEVER LOOK DIRECTLY AT THE SUN!) and what exactly is happening.”

This spring it is happening again! On Monday, April 8, 2024 another total solar eclipse is occurring,

the Great American Total Eclipse, but this time the sun will be between 95 and 99% obscured here in Michigan. The next solar eclipse that will be able to be seen in Michigan will be



in 2099! We will be hosting a SAFE SOLAR ECLIPSE VIEWING EVENT at Imagine Planet that day from 12 to 5 p.m. There will be solar eclipse activities as well as a solar viewer box and glasses to watch. DON'T

LOOK DIRECTLY AT THE SUN even if it is dark. It can cause permanent damage to your eyes.

Let’s hope for good weather on April 8 here in Jackson. Even if the weather isn’t good we will still have our eclipse event with activities and learning experiences. Come join us at 730 Tomlinson that day. It will be interesting to see if the animals react to the eclipse.

Frame My Future Scholarship Contest 2024

Eligibility:

- Intend to enroll as a full-time student at a U.S. college or university in the 2024-2025 academic year.

Carol Hines Memorial Scholarship Program

Eligibility:

To be eligible for CMP
