New Police, Fire Chiefs on the Job in Jackson

The City of Jackson has some



fresh but familiar faces leading efforts to keep our community safe. Jackson is welcoming Tim Gonzales as our new Fire Chief and Christopher Simp-

son as our new Police Chief.

Chief Christopher Simpson became Jackson's top cop in Feb. following the retirement of former Chief Elmer Hitt. The new Chief is a lifelong Jackson resident with extensive experience in local law enforcement. Simpson previously worked for Jackson police for 25 years, retiring as a Lieutenant in 2017. He recently served as Undersheriff for the Jackson County Sheriff's Office, a position he held since 2020.

Continuing the department's outreach work is a priority for Simpson. "Ensuring that citizens of Jackson remain safe and employees of the Jackson Police Department are highly trained, professional, and ethical in all policing endeavors. I plan on coming in and looking at where we are internally and make changes if needed," Simpson said.

With the separation of Jackson's police and fire departments earlier this year, Tim Gonzales ascended to the role of Fire Chief from Deputy Fire Chief. He's a Jackson native who has been with the Jackson Fire Department for 17 years.

Chief Gonzales has been leading Jackson's fire crews since 2023 following the retirement of former

Deputy Fire Chief David Wooden. The City has not had a Fire Chief position since 2010, when the police and fire departments were combined under Police and Fire Services.

Gonzales says he's looking forward to continuing programs that will make the community safer. "Programs like our car seat inspections show how we can help residents take preventative measures if an emergency does occur. Focusing on more risk reduction programs will show that we can assist with different aspects of community safety," Chief Gonzales said.

Former Chief Hitt was with the Jackson Police Department since 1996, working his way up to Chief from starting as a Police Cadet. Under his leadership, the police department greatly expanded its involvement in the community, such as launching the Group Violence Intervention Program, a community-centered approach that is reducing gun violence in Jackson.

"It was truly an honor to serve the City of Jackson as the Director of Police and Fire Services over the course of the past 8 years. Starting with JPD as an 18-year-old kid out of high school, I never expected to make it to where I did. I will forever be grateful for all those in my life that helped and guided me along the way. Law enforcement has been a great career and I will miss it, but I know I am ready to move on to the next chapter of my life," former Chief Hitt said.

The City of Jackson thanks former Chief Hitt for his service to the community and is looking forward to working with our new public safety leaders.

Hometown eats doesn't get much better than a local diner. Located at 3405 Brook-



lyn Road, Jackson 49203, Booher's is exactly what they advertise to be: a local diner with fresh, made to order food. As soon as you step through the door you immediately feel that everyone is welcome there.

With a small dining room, around 30 seats, it was clear this Friday evening that they do as much in take-out as they do in the dining room.

We started off with homemade cheese sticks. Now, I admittedly am a cheese stick snob, so if you are going to tell me that your cheese sticks are homemade, they better be amazing, and YES, they were! With a smaller menu (that's because it's all fresh and made to order), each of us decided to try something different. I opted for the spe-

cial chicken cordon blue, my son chose a burger, and Matt had a handheld sandwich. The portions are generous, and prices are very reasonable. I took half of mine home for the next day. The table next to us ordered the pasta special, and it was easy enough for two people.

With the portions so generous, we didn't have enough room for the pies they are known for, but we did get a slice of peanut butter pie to go. My son, who is a harsh food critic, stated that this was the best peanut butter pie he'd ever had, so I took notice. It was creamy and full of peanut butter flavor.

It's also worth noting that while we were there, two people who own local restaurants came in to dine. I think that says a great deal about an establishment when people who are in the food business choose to come to your place to eat. Booher's hit all the marks with good, quality food and service. It has 1.5-dollar signs and four stars.


