Get Active with the Walk, Roll and Stroll Jackson Program this Spring and Summer

A popular program that



has residents walking, rolling, and strolling through parks is returning to Jackson this year.

The Jackson Parks and Recreation Department, in partnership with AARP Michigan, invites residents of all ages and abilities to participate in the free Walk, Roll, and Stroll Jackson series.

The events are scheduled for May 7, May 21, June 4, June 18, July 2,

and July 16, with registration starting at 6 p.m. and the program commencing at 6:30 p.m. Participants will go on a non-competitive 3-mile route through local parks. Shorter routes are available.

The events will be split between Ella Sharp Park and Cascades Park, with the first Tuesday event listed each month, May 7, June 4, and July 2, at Ella Sharp and the third Tuesday, May 21, June 18, and July 16, taking place at Cascades.

For the Ella Sharp events, participants should meet in the soccer field parking lot off Birchwood Drive. When the program is at Cascades, participants should meet at the pavilion off the S. Brown Street parking lot.

The events are returning this year after successful programs over the past two years. "These events are a fun and easy way to get active this spring and summer," said Julie Weisbrod, the City's Active Living Coordinator. "We thank AARP for this continuing partnership to get our residents walking, rolling, and strolling through parks."

Prizes will be awarded at the completion of each event with a grand prize awarded on July 16. Schedules will be available at each event or on the 5th Floor of City Hall, 161 W. Let's SPRING into Some Fun & GET OUTSIDE!

Spring has arrived and brought with it rain, warmer temperatures, and sunnier days ahead; it has also brought with it the opportunity to get outside more. Many of us have experienced the joy that comes with running, jumping, playing, and soaking up the outside, but have we stopped to think about the benefits of outdoor play on a child's development?

We have all heard about our indoor voice and outdoor voice, or "No running inside the house!". inside play tends to be more structured due to its environment, but outdoor play allows for children to play larger: When we are outside, we can yell, run, jump, pull and more- it is a play centered around freedom and expression. This less structured environment helps build a child's sense of independence and confidence as they use their body to make larger movements and grow to trust their body.

According to the National Institute on Health, "Outdoors can be described as an open and constantly environment, changing where it is possible to experience freedom, gross, and boisterous movements, and contact with natural elements (2017)." The natural elements we encounter, such as sunshine, have a direct relationship to our

physical wellbeing, research shows that Vitamin D (which we get by being in sunlight) is essential for bone growth development, mood regulation, boosting the function of our immune system. This is one tiny example of the benefit of outdoor play on our physical development.

Exploration is another benefit of outdoor play. Exploration allows for problem-solving, creativity, persistence, and the opportunity for extended learning. As children explore new areas, they use their bodies in new ways to understand, traverse, and create meaning within their environment. Our outside environment changes time include:

and shifts: grass grows and withers, creatures can show up, temperatures change, clouds move and so much more - it makes for a new experience each time. As children work to understand this evolving environment it creates moments where their caregivers can teach/extend speech, gross motor skills, science and more.

The benefits of outdoor play are so much more than is mentioned here, but one thing is truly agreed upon: OUTSIDE PLAY IS AN ESSENTIAL PART OF A CHILD'S DEVELOP-MENT, so go ahead and **GET OUTSIDE!**

A few ideas for outdoor

Infants

- · Tummy time outside on a blanket
- · Provide opportunities to touch grass, leaves, and sand
- Go to a park where they can hear new sounds and be exposed to language

Infants & Toddlers

- · Blow bubbles to help develop awareness
 - Play peek-a-boo
 - · Play with colorful balls

Young Children

- Go on a nature walk
 - · Water play
- Create an obstacle course



College & Career Access Center, May Scholarships

Scholarship Fund

Eligibility:

The eligible applicant must be:

- · a graduating high school Senior or a high school graduate
- · continuing their education at an accredited institution in the year in which they are applying
 - a resident of Michigan.

For the MYLSF Scholarship they must be a youth exhibitor at the Michigan State Fair (2009 or before), Michigan Livestock Expo or the Michigan Dairy Expo for a minimum of three calendar years prior to the year of application. For the Statewide Scholarship they must be a youth exhibitor at a local, county, state-wide exhibition or state fair for a minimum of three years prior to the year of application.

Description:

Selection criteria consist of completed applications which include essays, letters of reference, and transcripts.

Completed applications will be judged on:

- 1. fair participation
- 2. leadership
- 3. volunteerism and

4. scholastic standing Preference will be given to applicants pursuing agricultural or related fields.

The American Indian **College Fund Full Circle Scholarship Program**

Eligibility:

- U.S. citizen or Canadian eligible to attend college in the U.S. under provisions of the Jay Treaty.
- · Enrolled in a certificate, associate, bachelor's, or graduate program at an accredited tribal, public, or private (non-profit) college or university.
- Full-time enrollment (Full Circle applicants only).
- · Registered as an enrolled member of a federal or state-recognized tribe, or a descendant of at least one grandparent or parent who is an enrolled tribal member. Alaska Natives may use Native Corporation membership. Learn how to prove descent or trace Indian ancestry.
- At least a 2.0 cumulative GPA. Your scholarship may require a higher GPA to maintain eligibility.
