# Jackson County Animal Shelter's Adoptable Pets: Kodiak and Maddie

If you're looking for a friendly, striking companion, Kodiak might be your guy. This one-year-old male Siberian Husky came to the shelter as a stray. He's super friendly and house-trained, and he did well when meeting new dogs as long as play didn't get too rough. Kodiak arrived at just 35 lbs, so he tends to eat very quickly. When he visited the cat room, he was a little unsure of the hissers. Like most Huskies, he is social, independent, and can be a bit stubborn, with a thick double coat and a strong need for companionship. What he really wants now is a home where he can settle in and be part of the family.

Availability dates reflect when dogs become JCAS property, and medical needs may delay adoption. A meet and greet with your dog is required, and a cat room walk-through is available to test reactions. Dogs go to approved applicants. Adoption fees are \$200 for medium/large dogs and \$300 for puppies/small dogs, including vaccinations, microchip, and sterilization.

# Why Did My Credit Score Drop? Common Scenarios & Examples

## What It Means When Your Credit Score Drops

A credit score dip can feel surprisingly emotional, like a setback or a judgment, even when you're doing your best to stay on top of things. But much of the time, it's simply your credit report updating with new information (such as a higher balance being reported, or a lender checking your credit after you applied), not a reflection of your financial instincts.

It helps to know that you don't have just one score. Different lenders may use different scoring models and versions, so you can see slightly different numbers depending on where you check.

Score movement is normal, even nationally. Experian reports the aver-

age U.S. FICO® Score declined to 713 in 2025 (down from 715 in 2024). That doesn't make your drop any less annoying, but it does reinforce this: score changes happen, and they can happen to anyone.

## Is This a Small Dip...or a Bigger Red Flag?

Before you start "fixing" things, take 2 minutes to figure out what kind of drop you're dealing with.

### A small dip (often temporary)

Usually 5–20 points, often tied to:

- A higher reported credit card balance (even if you pay in full later)
- A hard inquiry from a new application
- A new account lowering your average account age
- Paying off a loan (yes, sometimes this can cause a small dip)



### A bigger drop (investigate ASAP)

Often 20+ points, more commonly tied to:

- A missed payment that hit 30+ days late
- A big jump in credit card balances (higher utilization)
- A collection account
- A reporting error or identity theft concern

### Your Score Is Feedback, Not a Verdict

If your credit score dropped because of higher balances or missed payments, it's not a personal failure; it's often a reflection of how quickly everyday costs can add up. Credit score changes are signals, pointing to something on your credit report that shifted.

## Blasting Off Into Summer: A Closer Look at the Moon

Imagine Planet is moving forward toward a busy summer, blasting off, so to speak. Yes, I am still excited by the recent trip to the Moon, and yes, I am old enough to remember watching the first time a person stepped on the Moon on our black-and-white TV.

Our Earth-Moon system is unique in the solar system. While other planets have moons, none have one as large relative to the planet as ours (now that Pluto isn't considered a

planet). The Moon is about one quarter the diameter of the Earth, and it would take 81 moons to equal the Earth's mass. That gives us a diameter ratio of about 4:1. In contrast, Jupiter and Ganymede, its largest moon, have a diameter ratio of 26:1. The average distance between the Earth and Moon is about 238,855 miles, but because the Moon's orbit is an ellipse (slightly squished), that distance changes throughout the month.

What does having this relatively large moon mean for us here on Earth? What

would happen if the Moon suddenly disappeared? For one thing, we wouldn't have eclipses. The night sky would be much darker, a constant new moon. Coral and other marine animals even use moonlight to help trigger reproduction. Tides would still exist, influenced by the Sun, but they would be much weaker. Many organisms rely on tides for survival, and entire habitats depend on tidal movement.

The Moon also helps stabilize the tilt of the Earth's axis. This tilt governs the seasons and the

rhythm of day and night. Without the Moon, Earth would be a much less stable, and likely less habitable, place.

## Michigan First Credit Union Scholarship

- Graduates must provide proof of diploma)
- Have/will have applicable education expenses payable to the college or university the student will be attending.
