Hayes Development in Jackson Boosted by \$4.5 Million in State Funds

A major redevelopment



effort in Jackson has been boosted by \$4.5 million from the State of Michigan. The funding

support for The Hayes project comes from the 2025 State Budget through the Michigan Economic Development Corporation.

The funding was formally handed over to the City of Jackson by State Senators Sue Shink and Sarah Anthony on Tuesday, Oct. 15 during a check presentation event. \$4.5 million will go to the City to help close a funding gap needed for The Hayes development to move forward. The City sold the former hotel building to J. Jeffers & Co., a Milwaukee-based development company, in 2022. Since then, the company and local officials have worked to secure additional funding for the project.

The \$4.5 million allocation is the result of Mayor Daniel Mahoney and local business leaders advocating for additional funding to make the project happen. Mayor Daniel Mahoney says this will help accomplish a long-time goal of redeveloping this vacant property. "This is the icing on the cake of all the transformation that Downtown Jackson has had over the last 10 years. I am very appreciative to be here to witness it and be part of it," Mayor Mahoney said.

The \$40 million investment will rehabilitate the 10 story historic building into a rejuvenated development named The Hayes. Plans call for transforming the building to include 15 short-term rentals and 84 apartments. The marketrate apartments will be a mix of studio, 1 bedroom, and 2 bedroom units. The Hayes will also feature event, office and commercial space on the first three floors.

The Hayes property is located on W. Michi-

gan Avenue in the heart of Downtown Jackson. Built in 1926, the building functioned as a hotel until 1975. Consumers Energy used the property for office space until 2003. The City of Jackson took control of the building in 2004. For the past 20 years, the City has been preserving the building for future development. Efforts to sell the property

gained momentum in 2021 when the City started collaborating with the Anchor Initiative for economic development.

J. Jeffers & Co. has previously completed sizable rehabs of historic buildings in Milwaukee. Brian Loftin says his company is excited to start this project in Jackson. "The building has a solid core and shell.

Some may see blight, but we see a great opportunity," Loftin said. "One of the things that attracted us to the project was all the work that's already been done in the City, such as the vibrancy that you can see taking shape downtown."

With additional funding secured, renovation work on the property is likely to start in early 2025.

Tailless Whip Scorpion

When we first got our tailless whip scorpion at the Jackson Reptile Show over a year ago, I thought it was a strange whip scorpion, an animal I had cared for before. It was so small that it was easy to lose in the substrate of its small container. I did what I tell people not to do - I made an uninformed buy.

The regular whip scorpion is also known as a vinegaroon and has a long

whip-like that sprays vinegar! Like our new ambassador, the vinegaroon is a relative of spiders and scorpions. However. the tailless whip scorpion is not vinegaroon. does not have a tail and looks more like a spider than a scorpion. It has eight legs and eight eyes, but the two front

legs are elongated and look like whips. It also has two crablike pedipalps that are relatively huge and scary-looking. They are harmless to humans, however. You are much more likely to hurt them.

Tailless whip scorpions or whip spiders have even made it into the movies! An amblypygid, the Mexican tailless whip-scorpion was featured in the movie Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire. They can be seen in scenes with Mad Eye Moody, if you wish to investigate further.

pygids, the tailless whip scorpions are arachnids (spiders, ticks, and scorpions are also in this group). The leg span of these highly flattened arachnids ranges between 5 to 16 centimeters (2.0 to 6.3 inches). They are nocturnal and are found in caves, basements, tunnels, and under rocks and logs. Most species have only been described since 1994; we just don't notice them. They are found in North and South America, Africa, Asia, Eu-

rope, and Australia, usually in subtropical climates.

They eat small to medium size insects. They capture prey by seizing and holding it with their pedipalps and then killing and eating it with their strong jaws. Although they are Arachnids, they do not have spinnerets (tubular structures used to secrete silk thread) and therefore do not spin webs. Whip spiders do not produce venom and are harmless to humans. Whip spiders fasten their pedipalps together when mating to prevent Also known as ambly- the female from killing and

eating the male when mating is finished.

Tailless whip scorpions are kept in tall enclosures with arboreal climbing surfaces to allow for two things: enough vertical space for climbing and molting and enough space for heat to dissipate in order to keep the enclosure between 70°F (21°C) and 75°F (24°C). Five centimeters (2.0 in) of substrate at the bottom of the enclosure is generally sufficient to allow for burrowing and

> also serves as a method to retain water in order to keep humidity above 75 percent. Tailless whip scorpions live anywhere between five and ten years. Feeding can include small insects such crickets. mealworms, and roaches. Care and informational videos can also


be found on the internet.
