

medical procedures may cause a slight delay in the adoption process. A mandatory meet & greet with your dog is essential. A cat room walk-through is available to test reactions. Dogs will be placed with approved applicants, and the adoption fee is \$150 for medium/large dogs and \$250 for puppies/ small dogs, which includes vaccinations. microchip, and sterilization.

### Don't Be Fooled: How to Spot & Avoid Imposter Scams

Scammers increasingly rely on text messages and phone calls because they are a quick and effective way to reach a wide audience. Text messages often receive immediate attention, making them ideal for smishing (SMS phishing) attacks. Phone scammers are skilled at sounding professional and confident, building false trust that can disarm suspicion and make targets feel comfortable long enough for the scammer to carry out their scheme.

By creating a false sense of urgency or fear, scammers pressure their targets into clicking malicious links, sharing sensitive personal or financial information, or sending money directly. In many cases, scammers pose as someone familiar or trustworthy, such as a major retailer like Amazon or Xfinity, a financial institution, or even a government agency.

These impersonation attempts are known as imposter scams.

#### **How Imposter Scams Try to Trick You**

 Scammers often spoof their phone number and caller ID. This is intended to trick you into thinking the call or text is legitimate and they're actually contacting

you from the government, a financial institution, or a business you recognize.

- Scammers tell you there is a "problem", and it must be solved immediately to avoid consequences.
- Scammers will provide you with a fake employee name or badge number.
- · Scammers will send official-looking letters with seals and make up government agency names that sound real but aren't. They will provide you a fraudulent letter on your financial institution's "letterhead" using an image of from the inter-

#### **How To Avoid Imposter Scams**

- Never transfer or send money, cryptocurrency, gift cards, or gold to someone vou don't know in response to an unexpected call or message.
- Never provide your personal information, such as your social security number or online banking login, to someone over the phone.
- Don't believe anyone who says you have to quickly move your money to "protect" it. Anyone who tells you that is a scammer.
- If there's a problem with your account or identity, always talk about it with someone you trust - especially if the scammer on

the phone says it's serious, involves a crime, claims to be from the government, or insists that you don't talk to anyone about receiving the call.

- · Don't click on links or reply to unexpected text messages.
- Don't call back using contact information provided in unexpected mes-
- · If you think the message could be real, verify the story. Contact the organization in question using a phone number, website, or email address you know is real. Don't use contact information left in unexpected messages.



### Imagine Planet's Bug Day on September 27

Our special theme day for September will be on September 27 from 12 to 5 and will focus on bugs. Thank you to everyone who came out for Dino Day and made it such a success! We will be sure to do it again. Keep an eye on these articles and on our Facebook page for upcoming events.

The word bug has many meanings. In biology, the informal use is any insect or small crawling animal, such as a tick or spider. Spiders and ants are often called bugs. We will be focusing on insects, although other arthropods (jointed legs) may also be included. There is also a "true bug," which is a type of insect that has two pairs of wings, with the front or outer pair divided into a leathery bottom part and a membranous top part. These wing covers are held over the back and often partly folded. True bugs have needlelike mouthparts that allow them to extract fluids from plants and animals. True bugs undergo incomplete metamorphosis, with their young looking much like adults but without wings.

It has long been recognized that insects are the most diverse group of organisms, meaning that the number of species of insects is greater than any other group. In the world, some 900,000 different 27 for Bug Day!

kinds of living insects are known. This represents about 80 percent of the world's species. The true figure of living insect species can only be estimated from present and past studies. Most experts agree that there are more insect species that have not been described (named by science) than there are insect species that have been named. Conservative estimates suggest this figure is 2 million, while other estimates go as high as 30 million. Insects also probably make up the largest biomass of all land animals. At any time, it is estimated that there are some 10 quintillion individual insects

On Bug Day, you can learn what bugs in Michigan do in the winter, how to tell a moth from a butterfly, the parts of an insect and a spider, make bug crafts, and maybe even catch some bugs outside (depending on the weather). Bug trivia and lots of great bug pictures in books will intrigue older visitors. Come celebrate bugs with us!

### Youth Free Expression Scholarship

Description: The National Coalition Against Censorship and the New York Film Academy are thrilled to present the 2025 Youth Free Expression Film Contest. For over 20 years, we have invited young filmmakers to explore the powerful relationship between free speech and free expression in society. This year's theme is My Art, My Speech.

Art is a universal language. It's how we communicate our deepest thoughts, process emotions, and share the stories that shape our lives. Through art, we express our identities, challenge societal norms, and spark critical conversations about politics, culture, and the world around us. Art has the unique ability to push boundaries, raise awareness about important issues, and speak truth to power.

How do you use art to express yourself? Consider the following ideas when choosing a subject for your short film.

- Art is a vital tool for selfexpression in a democratic society! How does art help express beliefs, challenge the status quo, and provoke thought?
- Art has the power to raise questions and provoke discussions on important issues. How can art raise questions that society might avoid or find uncomfortable?
- What role does art play in reflecting and shaping personal identity and societal views on politics, culture, and norms?
- How does art help us confront difficult or controversial topics and express unpopular opinions?
- What happens when art is censored, and how does that impact the freedom of expression we all rely on?

Create a video (up to 3 minutes) using film, animation, photographs, music, or any creative tools at your disposal to explore what "My Art, My Speech" means to you as a student, an artist, an advocate, and a hu-

man

\*Warning: your video should NOT be created using A.I. While you may include examples of A.I. as part of your narrative or discussion, films generated entirely through A.I. will be disqualified.

Be thoughtful. Be creative. Be original. Be uncensored. Your voice, your art, and your perspective are powerful tools. Don't hold back. We want to see how you can use art to speak out and spark conversation about the issues that matter most to you. You can also check out our workshop on filmmaking at home, the most recent winners, Resources for First-Time Filmmakers, and a Filmmaker's Guide to Copyright and Fair

Eligibility: Upload your film to the YFEP Film Contest page on FilmFreeway and include an artist's statement articulating your film's message. Any genre of film is accepted, including but not limited to, documentary, music video, narrative, and

animation. The contest is free to enter.

Contestants must be either living in the U.S. or its territories (but need not be citizens) and must be age 19 or younger on the day the film is submitted. Films will be judged on content, artistic and technical merit, and creativity. Judges will be drawn from a panel of renowned filmmakers, writers, artists, and activists.

Award: \$1,000
Deadline: September 8,

#### **Gates Scholarship**

Description: Scholars will receive funding for the full cost of attendance\* that is not already covered by other financial aid and the expected family contribution, as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), or the methodology used by a Scholar's college or university. \*Cost of attendance includes tuition, fees, room, board, books, and transportation, and may include other personal costs.


Eligibility: To apply, students must be...

- A high school senior
- From at least one of the following ethnicities: African-American, American Indian/Alaska Native\*, Asian & Pacific Islander American, and/or Hispanic American
  - Pell-eligible
- A US citizen, national, or permanent resident
- In good academic standing with a minimum cumulative weighted GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent)
- Additionally, a student must plan to enroll full-time in a four-year degree program at a US-accredited, not-for-profit, private or public college or university.
- For American Indian/ Alaska Native, proof of tribal enrollment will be required.

Award: Award is Situation Dependent

Deadline: September 15, 2025
