

Nature of the Work

Dental Assistants perform a variety of patient care, office and laboratory duties. They sterilize and disinfect instruments and equipment, prepare and lay out the instruments and materials required to treat each patient, and obtain and update patients' dental records. Assistants make patients comfortable in the dental chair and prepare them for treatment. During dental procedures, assistants work alongside the dentist to provide assistance. They hand instruments and materials to dentists and keep patients' mouths dry and clear. They also instruct patients on postoperative and general oral healthcare.

Work Environment

Almost half of Dental Assistants had a 35 to 40-hour workweek in 2008. More than one-third worked part time, or less than 35 hours per week, and many others have variable schedules. Some Dental Assistants hold multiple jobs by working at dental offices that are open on different days or by scheduling their work at a second office around the hours they work at their primary office.

Education and Training

A period of on-the-job training is often required even for those who have completed a dental-assisting program or have some previous experience. Different Dentists may have their own styles of doing things that need to be learned before an assist can be comfortable working with them. As dental technology changes, Dental Assistants need to stay familiar with the instruments and procedures that they will be using or helping Dentists to use.
