A meeting of the Board of Managers of the Elisabeth Severance Prentiss Foundation was held via videoconference.

The following members of the Board of Managers were present: Pamela A. Alexander, Richard W. Mack, Mary A. Smith and Dominic V. Perry. William R. Robertson was unable to attend.

John A. Baco, Secretary, for PNC and Glen Danahey, Investment Advisor, for PNC.

Ms. Alexander presided.

The Trustee provided the Board with a full investment report prior to the meeting and Mr. Danahey reviewed the Foundation's current holdings and investment performance.

The Board was provided with a list of upcoming payments on outstanding grant commitments (see full list below). The Board found no issues with any outstanding commitments.

Mr. Baco provided current figures from the Trustee's report on funds available for grant-making purposes. As of March 31, 2023, the account value was \$91,904,686. Payments for 2023 totaling \$2,873,000 have been made in January 2023 prior to the meeting. The Board discussed the level of funding needed to reach the 5-year average 5% mark for tax purposes and still has a considerable amount of carry forward if needed.

The Board of Managers, having been given access to the grant applications online prior to the meeting, then discussed and acted upon 28 current grant requests (full list to follow).

There were no other items to discuss and the meeting was adjourned.
