#### Meeting of the Board of Managers

A meeting of the Board of Managers of the Elisabeth Severance Prentiss Foundation was held via Skype conference call.

The Board of Managers were presented with the investment review of the Foundation's current holdings and the Trustee's report of funds available for discretionary granting for review.

Having been previously given access to all current grant's progress reports and mailed the remaining payment schedule, The Board of Manager's were presented with all outstanding grant commitments and approved the continued payments of Previously Approved Grants (the full list of which below).

The Board of Manager's were then presented the new grant requests. The Board discussed that since the Foundation has already committed approximately \$4.3 million for 2020, no further grants would be approved for this grant cycle and we would continue to focus on meeting our multi-year grants previously approved. To follow is a list of all declined requests.

The Board discussed a CWRU request to reallocate a \$100,000 grant previously given to them in 2010 to the now support the Jenkins lab. It was approved by the Board of Managers.

The Board of Managers also discussed the ability to review a request from an organization to extend the grants funds passed the promised time frame due to COVID. The Board decided that we should review these on a case by case basis.

Pam Alexander and John Baco presented the need to move to a digital platform for grants applications, review and follow-ups. The Board has agreed and approved this need and cost associated with this.

There were no other items to discuss and the meeting was adjourned.
