A meeting of the Board of Managers of the Elisabeth Severance Prentiss Foundation was held via videoconference.

Ms. Alexander presided.

The Trustee provided the Board with a full investment report prior to the meeting.

The Board was provided with a list of upcoming January and June payments on outstanding grant commitments (see full list below). The Board found no issues with any outstanding commitments.

Mr. Baco provided current figures from the Trustee's report on funds available for grant-making purposes. As of May 19, 2021, the fund value was \$106,715,757.00. Payments totaling \$4,553,500 had been made in 2020 prior to the meeting, with \$4,035,500.00 already committed for 2021. The Board discussed the level of funding needed to reach the 5-year average 5% mark for tax purposes.

The Board of Managers, having been given access to the grant applications online prior to the meeting, then discussed and acted upon 18 current grant requests (full list to follow).

There were no other items to discuss and the meeting was adjourned.
