ENTRY REQUIREMENTS & SHOW POLICIES

ENTRY ACCEPTANCE:

- We kindly request that you create your Entry online at FoxVillage.com. If you are mailing an entry, please include the \$25.00 office fee (for manual entry into the FVD platform) in addition to the fees for the show. Be sure all required forms are signed by all people on the entry.
- Incomplete Entries, those missing documents or signatures will be charged an Incomplete entry
 fee of \$25.00. This fee is charged to cover the extra work needed to research missing data and
 manually add the data to your entry.
- Late Entries will be accepted online only when space allows with a \$50.00 late fee. The dates for submission of late Entries are listed on the first page of this Prize List.
- **Document look-up fee:** If your entry is missing registration numbers fir the horse or any person on the entry, we must research them and manually enter them. We charge a \$25.00 fee for the time needed to carry out this task.
- Mail in entries must be postmarked, or time stamped by the closing date listed in the Price List to be considered on time. Mail entries to: Michele Vaughn, 7541 Sloughhouse Rd., Elk Grove, CA 95624. No late entries will be accepted by mail.
- Checks returned by the bank will be assessed \$50.00 fee plus bank fees upon the first return and will not be run through a second time. A cashier's check or cash will be needed to clear the entry.
- Show management may close entries early if the show fills prior to the closing date. Entries submitted after the show is full will go on the wait list. Entries submitted but not accepted will be refunded minus the fees collected by Fox Village.
- Competitors will be advised of their entry standing via an entry confirmation email. Entry confirmations will be emailed. Please ensure that your email is set to allow emails from confirmations@foxvillage.com. Competitors are responsible for reading and responding to the entry confirmation. If the entry confirmation is not received by the closing date of the show, the competitor is advised to contact the show secretary. Please check this confirmation email to confirm that the classes you are signed up for are correct.
- No show numbers will be issued without completed entries, full payment, signatures, fees and confirmation of ALL necessary registrations and memberships. Competitors must check in at the show office to pick up numbers upon arrival.

REQUIRED ENTRY DOCUMENTS: (all required forms should be attached to Fox Village Entry)

- 1. Starr Vaughn Equestrian Liability Release. One for each person on the entry. A parent must sign if the rider is a minor. Be sure to fill in blanks on both pages. Attach both pages to the entry.
- 2. CDS entry Agreement (provided in this prize list)
- **3. Vaccination records for the horse**. Vaccinations (flu/Rhino) need to be given within six (6) months before the show dates, and at least 7 days prior to the show. EACH entry must have a vaccination form attached. (see USEF rule GR844)

- Emergency contact name and phone number: for ANYONE that will be mounted while on the show grounds <u>must be on the Entry</u>. This data should be listed on the entry and on all other forms.
- **COACHES PLEASE NOTE:** Coaches must be listed on the show entry and sign both the CDS entry and the SVE release.

MEMBERSHIPS:

- California Dressage Society membership: Your membership number should be included with your entry to accrue CDS points, this may show as "700" on the entry. For CDS sponsored shows, you must be a CDS member or pay a \$25.00 non-member fee. Joining CDS at the show will NOT get you a qualifying score with USDF. See The California Dressage Society website for information regarding membership benefits, shows and events requiring CDS memberships. https://www.california-dressage.org
- <u>Exceptions:</u> Horses, riders, owners/agents, trainers are exempt from CDS membership for "Introductory" classes.

All requests for change to an existing entry must be in writing. Email changes to: SVEDressageshows@gmail.com New USEF rules are posted regularly, please see GR rules (GR202, GR205, GR 206 for details).

OTHER INFORMATION and RULES:

- PONY MEASUREMENT CARDS: Competitors wishing to have their scores counted for pony awards must include a current pony measurement card with their entry.
- RIDE TIMES: Ride times will be emailed, posted at the show (near the indoor arena and at the show office) and on the Fox Village website (www.foxvillage.com). It is the rider's responsibility to inform management if ride times are not received and if there is a ride time conflict. Please do not assume lower levels will ride first, it may be necessary to run classes out of order. Due to weather and other factors, upper levels may be scheduled earlier in the day than lower levels.
- SCORE POSTING and TEST PICK-UP: Scores will be available live on FoxVillage.com. Tests
 will be available for pick up after the class is completed and placed by the scoring office staff.
 Only the competitor or representative may pick up the test from the office. Tests may be picked
 up at the show office window.
- **STALL GROUPS:** Please indicate ONE group name on your entry, if you are in a stabling group (The Barn name works well). Please indicate the day and approximate time of arrival on your entry. Contact the show Manager to make any special arrangements for early arrival and/or late departure. We endeavor to keep barn mates and riding buddies together; however, we may need to separate you if space dictates it.
- **FEED & BEDDING:** Please order feed and bedding before arrival. If you need to order additional feed and/or shavings at the show, you must fill out a request at the show office. Morning orders will be delivered by noon.

- STALL MOVE-IN: Inspect your stall prior to move-in. We will do our best to ensure stalls are ready for you, please inspect and report any damage to stalls upon arrival. Do not cut, nail or hang anything from stall walls. Damage to stalls will incur a \$100 repair charge. Permanent stalls with doors are 12'x12', Portable stalls with doors are 10'X10'. Bring your own water buckets for all stabling.
- FOOD: Food is available for purchase during limited hours.
- **LUNGING:** Absolutely no lunging in the warm-up arena. Lunging is allowed in designated lunging arenas only. See the site map.
- **ARENAS** and **FOOTING**: The performance arenas are sand, 20m x 60m. The outdoor warmups are sand, 120 x 260. The indoor arena is composite Euro Felt, 95 x 222. The outdoor courts are sand, 140 x 280.
- **VET**: Loomis Basin Equine Medical Veterinary (LBEMC) is the veterinarian on call for the show. Phone: (916) 652-7645
- **EMT**: Qualified medical personnel are on the premises at all horse shows. An Accident Plan is included in this prize list and posted at the show office.
- FARRIER ON CALL: Phone numbers will be posted at the show office.
- **DOGS**: It is preferable that dogs stay at home, any dog on the property must always be on leash. Please review USEF Rules GR1301.6.
- **VIDEO CONSENT**: SVE retains a professional videographer. No other entity may charge for video recording of riders at SVE Shows. Anyone recording must have the permission of the rider. No one is authorized to record video without permission. No one may post or publish videos without the permission of the rider/owner.
- RING ATTIRE RULE: Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors must wear protective headgear and must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120. Management can announce prior to or during a competition that competitors may show without jackets when extreme heat and/or humidity is forecast. This waiver applies to all classes including FEI classes at National Competitions. However, competitors must wear protective headgear and a shirt with sleeves and collar, without neckwear, and without decoration except as described in the rules. T-shirts are not permitted. Members of the Armed Services or police units may wear summer uniforms. (NOTE: For the show series coats will be waived based on weather conditions and will be posted and announced at the show).
- HELMET RULE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2013 (see GR801).: From the time horses are officially admitted onto the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time including, but not limited to non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time will be prohibited immediately from further riding until headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards

for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The helmet harness must be secured and properly fitted.

- SHARPS CONTAINERS, USEF rule GR1210.4: Competition management shall place a minimum of one Sharps container per competition, whether stabling is provided or not. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents for up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or Executive Director and/or the Hearing Committee.
- MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT (USEF rule GR1301.7): Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the abovedescribed motorized vehicles if they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters, is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- LIABILITY STATEMENT: The Horse show management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the horse show management and their decision will be final. The horse show management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel /award prizes, without claim of damage. Show management reserves the right to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or substitute officials. The judge's decisions are strictly their own and the management accepts absolutely no responsibility for those decisions. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges, cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.

SHOW CANCELATION POLICY:

- Shows will be held rain or shine. If all or part of the competition is interrupted, stopped or cancelled
 for factors including, but are not limited to, human communicable disease, equine communicable
 disease, a directive from USEF, air quality, weather, fire or other natural disaster, accident, or other
 acts of God, outside of show management's control, the competition will not be responsible for
 refunding any entry, stabling, office or any other fees.
- Equine diseases are known factors that could potentially impact the organizer's ability to run a
 competition as scheduled. USEF and EDCC offer a notification system to advise of equine
 diseases that could affect your participation in a licensed competition. If the competition is
 canceled due to a mandatory quarantine by CDFA or USDA prior to the closing date,
 competitors will receive a refund of all show fees less \$100.00 to their original form of payment.
 Fees paid to Fox Village are not collected by Starr Vaughn and will not be refunded.

COMPETITOR SCRATCH POLICY:

- SCRATCHES, CHANGES and CANCELLATION REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING AND SIGNED: It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the show management at (916) 869-7942 or (SVEDressageshows@gmail.com) of any scratches, changes and/or cancellations. Changes made to Entries after the closing date will be charged a \$25.00 fee per change.
- Refunds are given for Show scratches prior to closing date minus a \$100.00 fee. Fees paid
 to Fox Village are not collected by Starr Vaughn and will not be refunded. No refunds will
 be given after closing date for any reason, including acts of God, weather, etc. No refunds will
 be given on feed and bedding orders delivered. Non-refunded USDF qualifying fees will be paid
 to USDF per USDF rules.
- Management reserves the right to accept conditionally, cancel any entries, disqualify riders as exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel or combine classes.

BIOSECURITY PROTOCOL: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

• Communicable Disease Action Plan: The US Equestrian Federation requires competitions to follow a communicable disease protocol for humans and equines. This show will implement an "Isolation Plan" as directed by the USEF. The plan is designed to mitigate the spread of disease and must be followed by all people on the show grounds. The most recent requirements will be emailed to competitors and are posted on the show grounds. To mitigate the spread of communicable equine disease, such as but not limited to Equine Herpes Virus & Equine Influenza, all people on the show grounds must understand and follow basic biosecurity protocols. All riders, drivers, vaulters, handlers, owners, trainers, coaches, grooms, agents, and lessors must abide by and comply with biosecurity measures and equine health requirements imposed by the Federation, Competition Management, and local, state and federal animal health officials. Competitors, owners, trainers and coaches are responsible for making sure their guests follow the biosecurity guidelines.

BIOSECURITY PROTOCOLS:

- 1. Bring water buckets for your horse.
- 2. Avoid putting the water hose in your horse's water bucket when filling it.
- 3. Do not share tack, equipment, hay bags or grooming tools.
- 4. Don't allow horses to have nose-to-nose contact.

- 5. Limit public contact with your horse.
- 6. Limit contact between you and other horses.
- 7. Don't hand graze your horse where other horses may have grazed.
- 8. Wash your hands before and after contact with your horse or any other horse.
- 9. We strongly recommend you sanitize your horse stall prior to moving in.
- 10. Limit use of communal areas such as crossties and wash racks and do not use adjacent ties or racks when another horse is present.
- 11. Because humans can be an indirect means of disease transmission, avoid moving between barns unless necessary.

BIOSECURITY GUIDELINES:

- Current equine vaccination records must be included with your Entry. All non-stabled horses must also provide documentation of vaccinations. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. See USEF GR844.
- 2. Horses coming onto the show grounds must have temperature records. The temperature must be taken twice a day and recorded on a "Temperature Log" 3 days prior to arrival to the show grounds and throughout the show. A febrile horse/pony is one with a temperature above 101.5 degrees Fahrenheit or 101.0 degrees Fahrenheit on a NSAID. The document must be presented to the office at check-in and posted at the location of your horse for review by the Technical Delegate.
- 3. The "Temperature Log" is available for you in this prize list.
- 4. Horses showing signs of illness, including but not limited to fever, malaise, nasal discharge, acute neurological signs (i.e., wobbly gait, weakness, recumbency, etc.), vesicles on the nose, lips or tongue, within 72 hours of the show should not be brought to the show grounds. Horses that show any signs of illness during the show must be reported to the show office immediately. (Please read the SVE Isolation Plan sent to you via email and posted at the show office)
- 5. Show management must be notified if any vet is called to show grounds for any reason. Failure to notify show management may result in a fine and/or being required to leave competition grounds.
- 6. The show has an Isolation Protocol in place. Any horse found to present a potential for transmittable disease will be required to follow the Isolation Protocol. Failure to follow the Isolation Protocol may be fined and/or required to leave competition grounds.
- 7. If the Isolation Protocol is needed for a horse during the show, an Isolation fee of \$100.00/day will be charged to cover feed, shavings, PPE, disinfection and disposal of infectious materials.

Exhibitor is responsible to inspect stall and report pre-existing damage prior to using the stall.

How CDS, USDF, & USEF Memberships Work

CDS memberships run from December to December. If you join after October, you're considered a member for the following year. Part of your dues goes directly to the United States Dressage Federation (USDF) for your group membership.

Your group membership with the USDF entitles you to:

- 1. Rider Awards
- 2. Subscription to the USDF Connection (official USDF magazine)

You must join the USDF as a Participating Member and register your horse if you want to compete in the USDF Horse of the Year Awards, Breed awards or USDF/Great American Championship. Your Participating Membership with USDF is for the year November to November.

USEF (formerly AHSA) has no reciprocal membership agreement with CDS. In order to enter a USEF show, you must join the organization. Your USEF membership entitles you to:

- 1. A copy of the current rule book
- 2. Monthly issues of Horse Show Magazine

USEF memberships run from join date to join date. You must also record your horse with USEF.

All of these organizations memberships apply to both rider and the owner of the horse, if they are not the same person.

EQUINE ISOLATION PROTOCOL PLAN

Starr Vaughn Equestrian, Inc. 7541Sloughhouse Road Elk Grove, CA 95624

Do not bring you horse to Starr Vaughn if it shows any signs of illness. Signs of illness include but are not limited to fever over 101.5 degrees farenheit (or over 101.0 degrees farenheit if horse is on a NSAID medication), malaise, nasal discharge, sudden neurological signs (i.e., wobbly gait, weakness, recumbancy, etc.) or vessicles on the nose, lips or tongue.

The USEF recomends all competitors begin taking their horse's temperature 3 days befor a competition and continue throughout the competition. Record the temperatures on the temperature log provided to you by Starr Vaughn Equestrian or found on the USEF website (https://www.usef.org/forms-pubs/OBrQV_x6kNA/temperature-log). Post the log at the location of your horse so that it can be seen easily by the Technical Delegate.

This Isolation Plan is to be followed in the case of a symtomatic or fevered horse when symptoms arise. This plan is designed to contain an outbreak of infectious disease on show grounds. This plan will allow Show Management and the Show Veternarian to isolate and monitor any symptomatic horses, allowing other horses to continue competing at the show in a safe environment.

The <u>Isolation Stabling</u> is located near the round pen on Starr Vaughn property (Barn A/Isolation Barn) and is kept vacant for the purpose of quarantining horses that present with a fever or symptoms of disease.

Suspected Illness

If a horse presents with signs of illness and/or a consistently high fever (fever of 101.5 or higher), inform show management <u>immediately</u>. Show Management with direction from the Show Veternarian will determine whether the horse should be quarantined.

If a horse is deemed potentially infectious:

- The owner of the horse may remove the horse immediately to a Veterinary hospital or to a private home. Otherwise, the horse will need to be moved immediately to the Quarantine Barn at SVE.
- Owners, riders and trainers in the area where the potentially ill horse was stabled shall be notified of potential exposure.
- Owners, riders and trainers in the area of potential exposure will be reminded to continue to take temperatures twice daily and watch for clincal signs of disease in their horses.
- The horses in the area of potential exposure can continue to show as long as they remain symptom free.

Ouarantine Barn Protocols

- The horse will remain in the Quarantine Barn until a veterinarian determines that the horse is free of disease and/or negative laboratory results are received. Or until the horse us removed from SVE grounds.
- In the case of a quarantine imposed by State or other Government Officials, the decision to release horses will be at the discretion of those Officials.
- A horse in quarantine will not be allowed to compete in the show.
- No one is allowed in the quarantine barn unless accompanied by the Bio-Security Manager. Only owners or the person
 responsible for the horse will be allowed in the quarantine area. That person must follow the SVE required protocols to
 prevent cross contamination.
- Starr Vaughn Equestrian will charge \$100.00 per day for a horse housed in quarantine. This cost covers hay, shavings, Personal Protective Equipment, disposal of infectious waste and monitoring.

Bio-Security Protocols

- Do not share tack, equipment or buckets, hay bags, grooming tools.
- Have hand sanitizer and antibacterial foot baths available at each accesss point.
- · Do not allow unnecessary visitors in the barn area. Visitors should be instructed not to touch horses.
- · Do not allow horses to touch noses with each other.
- Do not submerge the end of the hose in water buckets.
- · Monitor your horse frequently for signs of disease during the event.

ACCIDENT PREPARIDNESS/EMERGENCY PLAN

Information to relay to Emergency Services.

Location: Starr Vaughn Equestrian, Inc. - 7541 Sloughhouse Road, Elk Grove, CA 95624

Directions for Emergency Services: From Sacrament/Rancho Cordova - Highway 16 (Jackson Highway) east, turn right on Sloughhouse Road (after the Grantline Road traffic signal), turn left into the facility. From Jackson - Take Highway 16 (Jackson Highway) west, turn left on Sloughhouse Road, turn left into the facility.

Additional Information for Emergency Services: Please turn off the flashing lights and sirens upon entering the showgrounds. A show staff member will meet the ambulance at the main gate and escort emergency services to the site of the accident.

Send someone to the front gates to direct Emergency Personnel to the site of injury.

PROTOCOLS FOR ACCIDENTS:

There is an EMT on duty during show hours. If the accident occurs at a <u>time outside of show hours</u>, call 911 and **notify** show mangement immediately.

- Ask the Ring Stewards or grounds people to call the EMT. All show personel have a radio for communication.
- The emergency number for show management is: (916) 869-7942

IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT SHOW MANAGEMENT AND THE TECHNICAL DELIGATE BE NOTIFIED OF EVERY INCIDENT IMMEDIATELY!

- The Ring steward or other show personnel shall ask competitors to move to another area away from the injured person(s) and be responsible for keeping the area clear.
- Notify the announcer of the incident so that appropriate directions can be given to the other competitors.
- Do not move the person(s) involved in the accident.
- The EMT will evaluate the injured person(s) to determine whether an ambulance should be called.
- If the person is unconscious, our policy is that an ambulance will be called.
- Determine if the energency contact person is with the injured person or needs to be called. Contact show office for emergency contact number.
- Prepare the area for an ambulance to enter, if necessary. Keep the area clear for the ambulance.
- The Show Manager will notify other rings that may be impacted by the arrival of an ambulance.

The EMT and TD will complete the USEF Accident/Injury Report Form and submit it to the Show Management and the USEF.

In the case of serious accident or fatality, contact USEF at (859) 225-6959 (weekdays) or (859) 312-5186 (weekends).

If the animal is injured:

Catch the horse. Ask if there is a person closeby that is responsible for the horse. If no responsible person is closeby, check with the show office to find the responsible person. If the horse requires veterinary care, and the only responsible person is unable to make decisions, the show management will contact a veterinarian and arrage for appropriate care.

ALL OFFICIAL STATEMENTS REGARDING THE ACCIDENT/INJURY WILL BE MADE BY COMPETITION MANAGEMENT.



GR844 Equine Vaccination Rule

- 1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
- 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log oftemperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
- 5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee

RIDER'S RELEASE, WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT 2025

WHEREAS, I understand and acknowledge that activities involving horses ("Equine Activities"), including but not limited to the mounting, riding, walking, dismounting, grooming, training, handling, feeding, and otherwise being in the physical proximity of horses is a dangerous activity which produces a foreseeable risk of mortal or serious personal injury and/or property loss to the participant in such activity as well as to the person or property of others; and

WHEREAS, I understand and recognize and warrant that this Release, Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement ("Release") is being voluntarily and intentionally signed and agreed to, and that in signing this Release I know and understand that this Release may further limit the liability of equine professionals to include any activity, whatsoever, involving horses, including death, personal injury and/or damage to property.

WHEREAS, I recognize and agree that the equine professional(s) at SVE has/have made reasonable and prudent efforts to determine my ability to engage in the "Equine Activity", and has/have sufficient knowledge of my equine and horseback riding skills as for me to relieve, release and hold harmless said equine professional(s) from any continuing duty to monitor my Equine Activities.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of being granted access and/or use of the facilities of Starr Vaughn Equestrian, Inc. a California corporation ("SVE") and for other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I agree as follows:

1. Assumption of the Risk. I hereby assume full responsibility for, and risk of, any death or bodily injury to myself or others (including, but not limited to, those matters set forth in the above recitals) and damage to or destruction of my property or the property of others, caused by my engaging in any Equine Activity either on the premises of SVE or elsewhere while working with an SVE equine professional, unless such bodily injury or property damage is attributable in full or in part to the gross negligence of SVE. My responsibility includes, but is not limited to, payment of (i) medical costs for myself and others that I may have injured, (ii) costs to replace my own property or the property of others that I may have lost, destroyed, or damaged, and (iii) damages for other non-medical and non-property items such as pain and suffering and lost wages, etc.

2. Release, Waiver of Liability, and Discharge of Claims.

- (a) I hereby release, waive, and discharge any and all claims that I may now or in the future have for damages against SVE, including its owners, occupants, tenants, subtenants, licensees, employees, officers, directors, or agents and the respective affiliated entities or persons of any one or more of them, arising directly or indirectly from my death, the death of any other person, bodily injury to me or others, or damage to my property or that of others, attributable to my engaging in Equine Activities, or my presence on SVE's premises.
- (b) I acknowledge that SVE requires me to wear AHSA approved headgear with a chin strap while jumping and requires me to wear a safety helmet while riding. I understand and acknowledge that the risk of head injuries and death are significantly reduced by wearing appropriate headgear. I hereby release, waive, and discharge SVE, including its owners, occupants, tenants, subtenants, licensees, employees, officers, directors, or agents and the respective affiliated entities or persons of any one or more of them, against any and all claims that I may now or in the future have for damages resulting from my failure to wear headgear while riding either on SVE's premises or at an offsite facility.
- (c) This release is intended to release, waive and discharge, in advance, SVE, together with its owners, occupants, tenants, subtenants, employees, officers, directors and their respective affiliates or persons of any one or more of them, from and against any liability arising out of or connected in any way with my or my guests or invitees engaging in any Equine Activities on the SVE premises or in any activity in which an SVE representative is required to attend on my behalf, and/or my or my guests or invitees presence on the SVE premises, even though such liability may be attributable, in full or in part, to the negligence, recklessness or misconduct of one or more of such persons or entities.
- (e) In accordance with such release, waiver, and discharge, and in consideration of being allowed to utilize and/or visit the SVE facilities, I promise not to sue or demand any money or anything else of value from SVE, including any of its owners, occupants, tenants, subtenants, employees, officers, directors, or agents and their respective affiliates or persons of any one or more of them.
- 3. <u>Indemnification</u>. I agree to completely indemnify and hold harmless SVE, including any of its owners, occupants, tenants, subtenants, employees, officers, directors, or agents and their respective affiliates or persons of any one or more of them, from and against any and all claims, demands, causes of action, suits, actions, losses, liabilities, costs and/or expenses, including attorney's fees, which are occasioned by, or otherwise attributable to, matters for which I have assumed the risk and for which I am responsible in accordance with Section 1 hereof, and for any actions brought by my guests or invitees.
 - 4. Binding Nature of Agreement. I agree that this Agreement shall be binding on my personal representatives, heirs and assigns.
- 5. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the internal substantive laws of the State of California, without regard to the choice of law rules thereof. I hereby submit to the in personam jurisdiction of the State of California. Venue for purposes of any litigation or arbitration concerning this Agreement shall be in Sacramento County, California.
- 6. Severability. In the event that any provision of this Agreement shall be void or unenforceable for any reason, then such provision shall be stricken and of no force and effect. The remaining provisions of this Agreement, however, shall continue in full force and effect, and to the extent required, shall be modified to preserve their validity.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a member-ship of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
