Greetings to our members. After a crazy winter weather pattern, the museum is glad to see spring, and hope that regeneration has a long arm! The board has been planning many more events and programs starting in April and finishing up in October with a Halloween party – all to be held at the Homestead.

Progress on Cheese/Milk Room Things are moving along! In November, Sarah Sportman, State Archeologist, with Scott Brady, of FOSA, dug four test pits in the Cheese room area dirt floor.



In the beginning of February, Michael Forino of Preservation Ct, along with Julie Carmelich of SHPO, visited the Homestead to see the Cheese/Milk room addition, view our drawings and hear our plans. They gave us good advice and direction and approval for the start of our restoration. We thank them both for their time and interest. On March 26th, Gil Bliss, President, and Brian McCormick, Vice President, conducted a tour for a reporter from the Day.

In April, we will need volunteers to help move out the last of the contents of the wing-3 parlor stoves, a 6 burner cookstove, in addition to an assortment of cook wares and tools. Date and time TBD, so watch our website for announcements.

In early May, we will start the disassembly, and salvage of original features, of the wing. Once again, we are looking for volunteers, skilled in

Our spring starting time will probably turn into summer. Needless to say, we are still actively searching contributions to bring us closer to our original \$250,000 goal.
