Growing/Care Information: Cut back late winter. Proves to be an outstanding, low-maintenance accent or borders plant. When planting liriope, do not install plants too deeply where the crown of the plant is buried. Keep liriope healthy by watering weekly as needed during summer droughts, don't over-apply mulch next to plants, and don't over-fertilize. When fertilizing, scatter fertilizer around plants but don't let fertilizer granules become wedged between leaves. These things can all stress and predispose liriope plants to become infected with leaf and crown rot. Do not plant liriope in poorly drained sites.

Type of soil: moderately salt tolerant plant. Well-drained to dry, average to poor, pH 4.5 to 6.4.

Light Needs: requires shade. Partial shade to full shade.

Watering Needs: Drought-tolerant; suitable for xeriscaping.

Landscape Uses: perfect for borders, edging and mixed beds, erosion control on banks and sloping terrain, large bed plantings and in woodland gardens.

CHRISTMAS TREE

LIRIOPE MUSCARI 'CHRISTMAS TREE'

USDA HARDINESS ZONE: 6 - 10

It has 1/2 wide, green leaf blades and Lavender flowers that spike like Christmas trees mid-Summer followed by near black berries.

LIRIOPE MUSCARI 'DENSIFLORA'

Densiflora, with its slim lily-like emerald foliage (3/8-1/2 inch wide), is a dense cluster with showy lavender flower spikes that resemble miniature grape hyacinths. Relatively adaptable to a variety of environments.

Spikes of purplish bell-shaped flowers resembling grape hyacinth appear in summer, followed by dark berry-like fruits. Great for edging pathways or as and a low border accent. Grows well underneath trees or between shrubs.

To maintain John Birchs' most attractive appearance, mow (or cut back its tops) in late winter or very early spring before new growth emerges - its crowns may impede otherwise.

Type of soil: performs best in well-drained acidic soils. It has good performance in partially shaded areas with moist soil. Moderately salt tolerant.

Light Needs: Full sun, Part sun, Full shade.

Watering Needs:

tolerates drought, poor soil, heat, humidity, slopes, and damp areas.

Landscape Uses:

This plant is almost indestructible in stubborn areas; it is perfect for banks, beds, and borders, or at trees bases (where roots impede other grass). Outstanding for erosion control.

JOHN BIRCH

LIRIOPE MUSCARI
'JOHN BIRCH'

USDA HARDINESS ZONE: 5/6-11

A thick, clumping, grass-like member of the Lily Family. It features golden, variegated, arching, slightly twirled leaves and lavender, grape-colored, hyacinth-like flowers spikes. It has, ½" wide, variegated leaf blades, green with yellowish-white margins. John Burch Liriope stays in clump form. It does not spread by rhizomes. Lavender cox-combed shaped flower spikes- Mid-Summer

Evergreen. Despite its name, this is more of a Lily-like plant than a true grass. It is the traditional ground-cover of the Japanese garden, planted at the base of pagoda lights and stone basins.

Growing/Care Information: prefers a moist but well-drained loose soil however will grow in most any average soil. When established it is quite drought tolerant and only requires supplemental irrigation during prolonged periods of severe drought. In the South, green-leaf varieties of Liriope muscari tend to look and perform better with some afternoon shade. Protect from snails. Fertilise in early Spring and remove any unwanted scruffy leaves

Soil type: Average, Well-Drained

Light Needs: can be grown well in a sunny position or in part to moderately heavy shade

Watering Needs: water regularly

Landscape Uses: best suited for use in rockeries and borders. It is very useful in mass plantings under trees and in other part sun to shady areas. This is a groundcover plant highly suitable for home foundation plantings. It can also be used singly or in combination with other plants in container gardens where it adds a very nice vertical accent and grassy texture.

'SAMANTHA'

A very hardy pink flowering Liriope with a clumping habit. Stems of bell-shaped pink flowers from early summer to autumn. Attractive flower, attractive foliage, shade tolerant, ornamental, non-poisonous to animals and humans.

True pink flower spikes rise above very dark-green foliage during summer, followed by attractive black berries. A tough, no maintenance, and good looking plant,

Adapts well to dry or moist conditions

perfect for borders, edging and mixed beds. Also used for erosion control on banks, slopes, large bed plantings and in woodland gardens. Shorter than other Liriopes, makes a good low border or edging. It is fine for ground cover in small areas, container gardens and borders.

SILVER MIDGET

LIRIOPE MUSCARI 'SILVER MIDGET'

USDA HARDINESS ZONE: 5/6-10

It has ½" wide, variegated leaf blades, green with Yellowish to white, irregular margins. Blooms with full, lavender, cox-comb shaped flower spikes mid-Summer. Silver Midget Liriope stays in clump form. It does not spread by rhizomes. It produces dark, evergreen foliage with irregular white variegation. Blades are about 3/8 inch wide.

Lavender flowers are produced on cockscomb-shaped spikes. 'Silver Midget' spreads slowly.

Features: Drought tolerant, low maintenance, irregularly variegated foliage, slow to spread.

SPICATA

A vigorous, creeping grass-like plant with pale lavender flowers that stand just above the foliage. In fall, the blooms are followed by spikes of black berries. Fast spreading plant for ground-cover or border. Has

Super Blue Liriope is an evergreen herbaceous perennial that averages 18 to 24 inches in height with a comparable spread. It is a grass-like clump grower, spreading by rhizomes and suckers. It has a moderate growth rate. It is a slightly taller-growing cultivar of Liriope.

Leaves are evergreen, linear-shaped, simple, 18 to 24 inches long and ½ inch wide with entire margins, and dark green in color. It has parallel veins and the leaves arise directly from the ground.

Growing/Care Information: The evergreen leaves can appear weather beaten with time. When this happens it is best to shear or mow plants back in fall or early spring to allow new fresh leaves to emerge.

Type of Soil: Grows best in good soil with average moisture but tolerates poor soils and dry conditions.

Light Needs: Partial Sun, Partial Shade, Full Shade. It prefers partial shade, but it will tolerate full sun. One of its greatest benefits is its shade tolerance. It grows readily in partial or full shade and creates a good ground-cover under trees.

Watering Needs:

It has good drought tolerance once established, so minimal watering is needed for survival in dry spells. As with most plants, though, ample irrigation in droughts keeps it healthier and looking better.
