OUR WORK IN 2018

The Trust's main activity is making grants to groups and individuals planning to make pilgrimages. Without the Trust's financial support, it would be difficult, if not impossible, for them to do so. During 2018 the Trust made 14 grants, which together amounted to £7,600. We supported individuals, as well as school groups helping disabled children on pilgrimage and people considering ordination.

BENEFITS TO PILGRIMS

We are always encouraged to hear how people benefit from making pilgrimages.

After their pilgrimage, one group leader reported on positive changes and emotions in the children on pilgrimage. Other student volunteers were said to have benefitted greatly from a spiritual and affirming experience. Reports from student pilgrims noted greater understanding about holy places and new ways of looking at the Bible as a result of making the pilgrimage. An individual described pilgrimage as 'an extraordinary journey'.

COSTS

The level of interest in pilgrimage seems to be increasing. The costs of making a pilgrimage are also increasing, to the point where we have been told that 'pilgrimage is becoming cost prohibitive for students'. We are determined to continue helping as many pilgrims as possible, even as both interest and costs increase.
