A YEAR LIKE NO OTHER

We will all look back on 2020 as an extraordinary year. Like many other organisations, we found it different from what we had expected and unlike any previous year.

Despite these differences and resulting changes, 2020 did not affect our ability to continue helping pilgrims.

The year began with a high number of applications. By the end of February there were more than in the whole of 2019.

A month later, pilgrimages were being postponed and pilgrimage sites closed to safeguard public health. Many pilgrims decided not to travel at all.

Some pilgrims whose pilgrimages had been postponed retained their grants for travel later in 2020 or in 2021.

Altogether during 2020, we made 12 grants amounting to £4,550, which was less than in 2019, a year that had seen historically high numbers.



We have no paid staff and no office to run. Trustees are not paid and do not claim expenses. We keep expenses to a minimum.

Apart from insurance premium and website maintenance costs (together less than £400 a year) all donations are used to give grants to pilgrims, helping them to travel.


