ON THE ROAD AGAIN...

In 2022, for the first time since the pandemic, the number of pilgrims travelling increased significantly. We saw the number of applications rise almost to pre-pandemic levels.

It was good to see more pilgrims travelling overseas. We helped pilgrims to the Holy Land and to Lourdes, as well as to less well-known places such as the shrine of St John the Evangelist on the Greek island of Patmos and the Seven Churches of the Revelation in Turkey.

At the same time, there was a good number of domestic pilgrimages. We helped pilgrimages to Walsingham and to Rochester, as well as a pilgrimage visiting the 12 ancient churches along the Ridgeway and an Easter Cross walk to Worth Abbey in Sussex.

We gave grants to solo pilgrims, to parish and school groups, to a clergy study group and to students training for ministry - helping them all travel their own pilgrim road.



Our overriding aim is to make grants to as broad a range of pilgrims as possible. Because we are a small charity, the grants we make tend to be relatively modest.

We want to help more pilgrims. We want to give them bigger grants.
