


# DARKI MY WAY

## Supporting Children Who Cannot Live at Home



### UNDERSTANDING THE CHALLENGES

Children unable to remain in their homes frequently encounter notable emotional and psychological challenges. They may experience difficulties related to loneliness, insecurity, and adaptation as they transition to new environments and caregivers. The lack of established routines and the absence of familiar family support can undermine their sense of stability, potentially impacting their ability to establish trust and develop healthy interpersonal relationships. These factors may contribute to challenges in academic achievement, social skill development, and overall well-being.



### THE IMPORTANCE OF SUPPORTIVE HOMES

Proper support can greatly impact a child's future. When a family temporarily welcomes a child, emotional adjustments are needed for a stable home. Children placed in unfamiliar families may resist or act out due to insecurity and discomfort.

**Group homes**– supervised apartments for teens aged 18–25 who cannot live at home or alone. Separate facilities for men and women.
