From the Pastor’s Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Earlier this year, a sink hole had developed on one of the roads in the upper part of the North Country and within our diocese, rendering travel on a portion of it impossible until it was repaired. During that time, I was speaking with a priest north of it. I had told him it would be nice to meet up for a visit, but I quoted this Sunday’s Gospel from Saint Luke and reminded him that between us a great chasm has been established, preventing me from going to his side or for him to come to my side! How the scriptures speak so particularly to us at times of the elements we bear, and even humorously in certain instances! Fortunately, that chasm was only temporary and after several weeks, it was fixed and the portion of the road reopened.

The story of this Gospel is situated in the hereafter, but I think the image of a chasm is one that is relevant in our world here and now. Doesn’t it seem at times that there are many chasms between people? Think of the nations of the world and their conflicts, our own nation and her people, perhaps in local communities, organizations, families, and with friends...even within the Church. People in many instances seems to be at opposites sides of a chasm for various reasons, with it also appearing as if to pass from one side to another is just not feasible. The questions we need to ask is whether any chasm is permanent or can it be filled in and eliminated. When we are talking about the people of the world, in many groupings, we need to see that it is something that can be filled in and eliminated, just like the one on the road that was temporary. This is always possible when we believe in God’s love, forgiveness, reconciliation, and the strength through faith that the Lord has given us to share these most sacred gifts. Let us always believe that no chasm is irresolvable. If we as people have created the chasms of our lives and world through failure and omission, then we can take them away with love, mutual respect, and togetherness. May the efforts we make help us to discover this great hope!
