Or

**Pause 3 — Being the Church**

*We are called to be the Church: to celebrate God's presence, to live with respect in Creation...*

**Reflection Questions:**

- What does *being* the Church mean outside of the building?
- What does *living with respect in Creation* look like in your everyday life?

It was a good couple of hours and I could see the Spirit doing a little nudging to help them answer the questions in wonderful ways. We are hoping for a Sunday June 22 Confirmation, including celebrating the kids in our congregation so please do your best to attend and bring along any of your children or grandchildren so we can enjoy their presence and devour some hot dogs afterwards.
