# **Charles Joly Lilac**

**Height: 10-12 ft.** 

Spread: 8-10 ft.

Full Sun

**Zone 3-7** 

A popular earlier French hybrid that bears smallish panicles of purple buds that turn to magenta double flowers as they open. Seldom fed on by Japanese beetles.



#### **Common Purple Lilac**

**Height: 12-15 ft.** 

Spread: 8-12 ft.

**Full Sun** 

**Zone 2-7** 

This is the old-fashioned lilac most of us remember from our youth. In May, it sports extremely fragrant flowers that vary in color from purple to lilac and occasionally even white amid blue-green foliage. Cut flowers hold up extremely well and fill the house with their fragrance. Seldom fed on by Japanese beetles.



#### James MacFarlane Lilac

Height: 8 ft.

Spread: 6-10 ft.

**Full Sun** 

**Zone 2-7** 

A University of New Hampshire creation, James MacFarlane lilacs bloom two weeks earlier than most lilacs. This extremely hardy and adaptable shrub withstands moisture conditions fatal to many lilacs. True single pink flowers bloom freely.



## **Ludwig Spaeth Lilac**

**Height: 10-12 ft.** 

Spread: 6-8 ft.

**Full Sun** 

**Zone 3-7** 

This older cultivar developed in 1883 is still one of the best purples out there. Panicle-like thyrses of single, red-purple flowers are produced in early June. Seldom fed on by Japanese beetles.



# Miss Ellen Willmott Lilac

Height: 10 ft.

Spread: 10 ft.

Full Sun

**Zone 3-7** 

Miss Ellen Willmott is a dependable French hybrid that bears thyrses of beautiful double white florets on a nicely rounded shrub that typically reaches about ten feet in both height and breadth. Seldom fed on by Japanese beetles.



#### 'Miss Kim' Lilac

Height: 6-7 ft.

Spread: 5-6 ft.

Full Sun

**Zone 3-7** 

A hardy lilac from Korea with purple buds that open to single, pale lilac flowers after other lilacs have finished. Incredibly fragrant, this broad, spreading shrub has dark, glossy green foliage that turns a striking burgundyred in the fall. With her incredible aroma and stunning color, 'Miss Kim' is a delight to all the senses.



#### **Mount Baker Lilac**

**Height:** 10-12 ft.

**Spread: 10-12 ft.** 

**Full Sun** 

**Zone 2-7** 

A very hardy cultivar with single white blossoms that come into flower before French hybrid lilacs. This large, profusely blooming, very fragrant shrub is excellent for background use. Green foliage takes on a purple tint in the fall.



#### **Pocahontas Lilac**

**Height:** 10-12 ft.

**Spread: 10-12 ft.** 

Full Sun

**Zone 2-7** 

An exceptionally hardy and vigorous lilac that blooms profusely in spring, prior to the French hybrid lilacs, covering the plant with deep maroonpurple buds that open to single deep violet florets.



# **President Grevy Lilac**

**Height: 10-12 ft.** 

Spread: 8 ft.

**Full Sun** 

**Zone 3-7** 

A vigorous, upright shrub that produces large panicles of starry, double lilac-blue florets. Seldom fed on by Japanese beetles.



# President Lincoln Lilac

Height: 8-10 ft.

Spread: 10 ft.

**Full Sun** 

**Zone 3-7** 

Possibly the truest blue of any lilac, this French hybrid bears thyrses of single, medium blue flowers. Solid grower that produces basal shoots readily. Seldom fed on by Japanese beetles.



# **Sensation Lilac**

Height: 8-10 ft.

Spread: 8-12 ft.

**Full Sun** 

**Zone 3-7** 

Truly outstanding and unique, Sensation Lilac was created by a mutation of 'Hugo de Vries' that results in single purple florets with a distinctive pure white border. Seldom if ever fed on by Japanese beetles.



### Tinkerbelle® Lilac

Height: 5-6 ft.

Spread: 4-5 ft.

Full Sun

**Zone 3-7** 

This recently developed compact lilac possesses a

growth habit and bloom time similar to those of Dwarf Korean lilacs. Tinkerbelle® has a pleasing, spicy fragrance and incredible wine-red flower buds that open to pink.



# Wedgewood Blue Lilac

Height: 6 ft.

Spread: 6-8 ft.

Full Sun

**Zone 3-7** 

This showy, fine-fragranced lilac is unique for its lilac-pink buds and large, beautiful racemes. Its resistance to mildew is excellent, and it is rarely to never fed on by Japanese beetles.
