Achillea ‘The Pearl’ Superior

Height: 18-30”

Spread: 18-24”

Full Sun to Part Shade

Zones 3-9

Commonly called “Sneezeweed” or “Sneezewort”, this pretty little plant is not particularly allergenic, despite its name. ‘The Pearl’ bears clusters of fully double, small, white, pompom blooms with tiny yellow centers, suggestive of a large, double Baby’s Breath. This easily cultivated plant spreads readily to make an effective “wild” border and supplies copious cut flowers from spring until frost, enjoyed either fresh or dried.



Anise Hyssop

Height 3'

Spread 2-3'

Full Sun

Zone 4-9

This gorgeous late summer bloomer is loaded with blue-violet flower spikes from late July through September. This pollinator favorite has a lovely anise (licorice) fragrance. It likes full sun and is tolerant of drought and heat stress. Anise Hyssop pairs beautifully with Black-eyed Susan for a classic blue and gold combination.



Silver Mound Artemisia*

Height 12”

Spread 15-24”

Full Sun

Zone 3-9

This low-growing, mounding plant bears soft, silvery grey foliage and is perfect for rock gardens or edging. It does well in average to poor soil, as long as it is well-drained. It is an excellent plant to use in order to cut down on watering.



Purple Dome Aster

Height: 18 in.

Zones 3-8

Full Sun to Mostly Sunny

This dwarf variety of New England Aster forms rich mounds of striking dark green foliage supporting purple, daisy-like blossoms with sunny yellow centers which remain in bloom from late summer to late fall. This durable and long-lasting bloomer supports bees, butterflies and other pollinators right up until season's end.



Bridal Veil Astilbe (Plume Flower)

Height: 18 in.

Part Shade

Zone 3-8

Brilliant white florets rise on a loose, gracefully arching plume. New leaves emerge bronze and fade to green. ‘Bridal Veil’ blooms early in the season. It is deer-resistant and prefers full to partial shade.



‘Maggie Daley’ Astilbe (Plume Flower)

Height: 24 in.

Part Shade

Zone 3-8

A mid-season bloomer, ‘Maggie Daley’ sports deep fuchsia flowers on rich, forest green foliage. Plumes form a very solid spate, which is excellent for drying.



‘Peach Blossom’ Astilbe (Plume Flower)

Height: 24 in.

Part Shade

Zone 3-8

A staple among Astilbes and very fragrant, ‘Peach Blossom’ is an early-season blooming and very floriferous plant with peach-pink, blocky plumes atop lush green and reddish-green foliage.



Balloon Flower ‘Astra Pink’

Height: 8-10”

Spread: 6-8”

Partial to Full Sun

Zone 3-8

Unique balloon-shaped buds open into three-inch, five-lobed, bell-shaped flowers. ‘Astra Pink’ is an excellent choice for pots, containers and window boxes. Exceptional branching and thick flower petals on this compact and uniform plant make for long-lasting pink blooms.



Balloon Flower (Fuji series)

Height 2-3' Zone 3

Part Shade or Light Shade

Balloon flower is an excellent choice for shady locations. Two- to three-foot tall perennial plants produce balloon-like buds that open into 2-inch flowers from June to August. Winter hardy to Zone 3. We carry them in pink and blue.



‘American Goldfinch’ Baptisia

Height: 3 - 3.5 ft.

Spread: 4.5 - 5 ft.

Full Sun to Part Shade

Zone 4-9

This big, bold and beautiful native cultivar makes a dramatic statement in your garden come late spring. One of the most floriferous Baptisias, ‘American Goldfinch’ produces loads of bright yellow flower spikes for many weeks and attractive round seed pods in the fall. Easy to grow and thrives with little maintenance.



Baptisia australis (False Indigo)

Height 3-5' Zone 3-10

Spacing 2-3'

Full Sun to Part Shade

Baptisia forms a bush at maturity, with dense clusters of deep blue flowers on upright 4-16 inch long spikes. Baptisia lives a long time, but spends most of its energy underground when it is young and may not flower right away. But when it does, it is gorgeous! Over time, the blossoms get showier against blue-green foliage, and its seed pods are also attractive. Baptisia provides an excellent backdrop for other flowering plants later in summer.



Black-eyed Susan

Height: 24-30”

Spread: 24-30”

Full Sun

Zones 3-9

A classic favorite, Black-eyed Susan produces masses of showy, golden-yellow, daisy-like flowers from July to mid-October. Goldfinches love the seeds of this vigorous perennial that prefers fertile, loose soil.



Dicentra Spectabilis (Bleeding Heart)

Height: 27-35 in.

Part Sun to Part Shade

Zone 2-9

An old-fashioned favorite that bursts into rows of bright bleeding heart-shaped blooms on arching stems that rise above fern-like foliage in late spring. It forms a bushy upright mound of light green foliage with a somewhat ferny appearance. Dangling bright pink locket flowers on arching stems are excellent for cutting. Prefers rich, moist soil with partial shade, or at least protection from hot afternoon sun.



Bleeding Hearts are a long-time favorite. They like morning sunshine and afternoon shade and prefer moist, fertile, alkaline soil. They do well when planted among hostas. This Zone 3 perennial should be planted at the same depth as it is in the pot.



Butterfly Weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*)

Height: 1-3 ft.

Spread: 1-2 ft.

Full Sun to Partial Shade

Zones 3-9

This deer-resistant member of the milkweed family is native to eastern North America and earns its name by attracting butterflies (particular queens and monarchs, whose larvae feed on its foliage) and other pollinators with its June- and July-blooming bright orange flowers and copious amounts of nectar. This upright perennial with oblong leaves is best adapted to sunny sites with well-drained or dry soil.



Campanula Medium Champion Blue

Height: 12-24”

Spread: 12-24”

Partial to Full Sun

Zone 3-9

Rich, dark blue, cup-like flowers stand on a saucer-like calyx. The large June- and July-blooming flowers on these old-fashioned favorites are excellent for cutting.



Campanula Medium Double Mix

Height: 24-36”

Spread: 12-16”

Full Sun or Partial Shade

Zones 2-9

A double-flowered form of old-fashioned Canterbury Bells that deserves to be grown more often today than it is. Plants form a low rosette of green leaves in the first year. The following year, upright stems will bear loads of large, dangling bells in early to mid-summer. The mixture includes shades from white through pink, rose, blue and lavender. Stems are superb for cutting, and plants will self-seed if allowed.



Centaurea montana

Height **12-24”**

Spread **12-18”**

Full Sun

Zone 3-8

Also known as perennial bachelor’s button, mountain cornflower or mountain bluet, Centaurea montana is an erect, clumping perennial featuring single, fringed, rich blue flowers, which appear in late spring atop grey-green, lance-shaped leaves. It is very easy to grow and tolerates both poor soil and drought.



Chelone lyonii ‘Hot Lips’

Height 2-4’ Zone 3-8

Spread 18-30”

Full Sun to Part Shade

Commonly called “turtlehead”, this upright, clump-forming member of the figwort family sports snapdragon-like rose pink blooms atop stiff, square stems amid coarsely-toothed green leaves from July to September. ‘Hot Lips’ prefers moist soils and can tolerate close to full shade. Its showy flower is a favorite of butterflies.



Columbine (Aquilegia)

Height: 1-3 feet

Spread: Up to 2 feet

**Sun or Light Shade, Good Soil
Zones 3-9**

This easy-to-grow perennial offers season interest throughout much of the year. It blooms in a variety of colors during spring and early summer. Blooms emerge from attractive green foliage that turns maroon-colored in the fall. A favorite of both hummingbirds and cut-flower enthusiasts, these bell-shaped treasures dancing in the breeze are good companions to many flowers.



Coreopsis

“Moonbeam”

Height: 18-24 in.

Zones 4-9

Full Sun

This drought-tolerant Coreopsis works especially well in the front of the garden or in a rock wall. Pale yellow blooms glow all summer long atop delicate pinnate foliage. This plant enjoys regular moisture and well-drained soil. Long blooming time allows plenty of opportunities for pollinators to visit its glorious yellow flowers.



Coreopsis Sunkiss

Height 12-14” Zone 4-9

Spread 14-16”

Full Sun

Also known as “Tickseed”, Coreopsis Sunkiss forms a low mound of leathery green leaves giving rise to long-lasting single bright yellow daisy-like flowers with dark red-brown centers. This perennial tolerates heat and humidity without getting floppy and easily attracts butterflies.



Coreopsis Sunray

Height: 24”

Spread: 15-18”

Full Sun

Zones 3-10

Very floriferous, Coreopsis Sunray (Tickseed) is a compact perennial featuring a mound of bright golden-yellow two-inch diameter double flowers that bloom on two-foot tall stems over finely-divided dark green foliage for eight to twelve weeks through the summer.



Shasta Daisy

Height: 36-42"

Spread: 18-30"

Full Sun

Zone 4-9

The quintessential daisy, Shasta daisies sport large, single white flowers with bright yellow centers on strong, sturdy stems that hold up in wind and rain. Foliage is a deep, lustrous green and holds up well in heat and humidity. Shasta daisies also make excellent cut flowers.



Daylily 'Happy Returns'

Height 1-3'

Spread 1-3'

Full Sun

Zone 3-9

'Happy Returns' lives up to its name with fragrant three-inch buttery yellow flowers that seem to bloom endlessly from May to frost. Really easy to grow, this daylily is perfect for a perennial bed, garden border or container. It attracts hummingbirds and butterflies but is resistant to deer and rabbits.



Daylily ‘Night Whispers’

Height 20-24”

Spread 24-28”

Full Sun

Zone 2-9

Sweetly fragrant, ruffled blooms make this extremely easy-to-grow re-blooming daylily a must-have for almost any summer garden. The abundance of blooms and color makes this variety a great addition to larger plantings and borders. Tolerant of any soil type and a range of light from full sun to part shade. Deer resistant.



Daylily 'Pardon Me'

Height: 18"

Full Sun or AM Sun/PM Shade

Zone 3

Three-inch, fragrant flowers adorn this fast grower and prolific rebloomer. Flowers are deep red and colorfast, very resistant to fading.



Daylily ‘Purple d’Oro’

Height: 14-20”

**Full Sun or AM Sun/PM Shade
Zones 3-9**

This reblooming daylily flowers all summer and into fall with showy magenta-purple blooms with chartreuse-yellow throats. One of the longest blooming daylilies, Purple d’Oro makes a perfect addition to a border, mixed bed or container. Beautiful, water-thrifty, easy-care, rabbit-resistant and pollinator-friendly, Purple d’Oro has it all!



Delphinium Connecticut Yankee Mix

Height: 24-30”

Spread: 18-24”

Full Sun

Zones 2-9

This variety of delphinium is well-branched, more so than the more familiar spikier types. Plants form a low mound of deeply cut green leaves beneath upright bushy stems that bear lots of large, single, satiny two-inch flowers in a range of white, lavender and blue tones. This variety makes a long-lasting cut flower.



Delphinium Magic Fountain Mix

Height: 30-36”

Spread: 18-24”

Full Sun

Zones 2-9

This mid-sized delphinium series features strong stems with large spikes of flowers in shades of white, pink, blue, lilac and purple, sometimes with a contrasting center called a “bee”. This variety serves well in the garden border or as a cut summer bloom.



Pacific Giant Delphinium 'Black Knight'

Height: 48-72"

Spread: 18-24"

Full Sun

Zones 2-9

Pacific Giant is an excellent large-flowered series for garden or cutting. 'Black Knight' bears deep violet blossoms with a black bee, the darkest delphiniums available.



Dianthus ‘Amazon Rose Magic’

Height 18-36”

Width 10-12”

Full Sun

Zone 4-9

This upright dianthus is frost tolerant; attractive to bees, butterflies and hummingbirds; fragrant; heat tolerant; and low maintenance. This flower is an exceptional choice for cut flowers bouquets, and the more you pick it, the more it blooms!



‘Plenty o’ Hot Pink’ Dianthus

Height: 16”
Full Sun
Zone 3

A voluptuous plant covered with striking one-inch hot pink blooms over green foliage all summer into fall. Makes a great cut flower. Deer resistant.



‘Rockin’ Red’ Dianthus

Height: 20”

Spread: 12”

Full Sun

Zone 4

Lacy, deep red, scented, fully-branched flowers make this intense dianthus a truly spectacular plant. Three-inch flowers bloom in clusters from early spring well into fall. Durable performance, dependable overwintering, and long bloom time make ‘Rockin’ Red’ a great border plant that makes an outstanding contribution to beautiful bouquets.



Spring Beauty Mix Dianthus

Height: 18”

Spread: 12-36”

Full Sun to Part Shade

Zone 4

Fragrant, fringed, semi-double and double flowers in white to red shades bloom in the late spring of the plant’s first year. This variety works well for edging, in the front of the border, as a ground cover plant, for rock gardens or interplanted into rock walls.
