## **April 6, 2020**

**Celery** has been transplanted into packs for sale. While celery prefers moderately cool temperatures, if it's exposed to temperatures below 50°F, it tends to bolt (go to seed).

**Cold crops** (Brassicas, such as broccoli, cabbage, kale, cauliflower and Brussels sprouts), **Swiss chard** and **lettuce** will be planted this week and should be ready for mid-May planting.

We also have lots of **parsley**, which is not just tasty for humans, but essential for pollinators. Perhaps you're acquainted with the **parsley worm caterpillar**. It comes by its name honestly; it loves parsley, though it can also be found on carrots, celery and other plants in the Apiaceae (Umbel) family. This handsome, bright-green-and-black caterpillar eventually morphs into the **black swallowtail butterfly**, who, it appears, is back for the season based on recent sightings.

The **tomatoes** have also been planted. Check out our Tomatoes Catalog to see what we are offering, along with a note on determinate vs. indeterminate tomatoes.

## **March 30, 2020**

Today we transplanted **broad-leaf, or culinary, sage** to sell as individual plants or in four-packs. Easy to dry and impossible to leave out of fall dishes! Get some for your Thanksgiving turkey... and stuffing!
