The Taft Alumni Association is pleased to announce the six recipients in this year's Alumni Hall of Fame. They represent an impressive range of talents, in the arts, in academia, and contributing to others in sciences and business. They also settled all over the country.

Since our last induction in 2019 the world has changed -- there were teacher's union strikes, the stresses of COVID-19 which kept local schools closed, on remote learning, for the better parts of several school years, and other unpredictable changes. Chicago Public Schools opened in mid-August instead of after Labor Day.

With rising travel costs, and the unpredictability of train travel and flights in and out of O'Hare Airport combined with trying to schedule a date within Taft's busy fall schedule we are going to try to assemble the presentations online, with Zoom interviews with the recipients and/or their nominators and will post the "virtual" ceremony video early in 2023 on our TAA website, so friends and classmates can share in the celebration.

Meanwhile, here are the biographies of this year's recipients, a selection of some of the Best of Taft High School:

John E. Anderson, PhD, PE, GE, D.GE Class of January 1965



While at Taft, John Anderson was a member of the National Honor Society and was awarded an Illinois State Scholarship. He was a member of the Norwood Park Imperials Drum and Bugle Corps playing a bass-baritone bugle.

After a short time at Wright Jr. College, he was educated at Northwestern University in Evanston, IL, earning a BS Civil Engineering (1968)



earning a BS Civil Engineering (1968), MS Civil/Geotechnical Engineering (1971) and PhD Civil/Structural Engineering, (1974). He is a licensed Civil Engineer and Geotechnical Engineer in California, and licensed and a Board-Certified Diplomate at the Academy of GeoProfessionals, American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) Reston VA.

Anderson has over 45 years' experience in design and construction of heavy civil works with expertise in geotechnical and foundation engineering. Throughout the U.S. and abroad, he has served as project manager, task lead or senior consultant/expert on projects including bridges, highways, tunnels, pipelines, fossil and nuclear power plants, water and wastewater facilities, dams and levees, industrial facilities, landfills, and high-rise buildings. He has been an expert witness for design and construction disputes.

Anderson has served on the West Contra Costa Unified School District Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee since June 2020 and became chairperson in June 2021. From June 2018 to April 2020, he served as a member of the Contra Costa Civil Grand Jury that investigates the conditions in the county jails as well as the performance of county and city government, school districts and special districts such as water, sewage, transportation entities.

From 2006 to 2010, Anderson served as cochairman of ASCE's Task Force on Implementation of Lessons Learned from Hurricane Katrina. A great deal of the technical work was incorporated into guidance documents prepared by ASCE, the US Amy Corps of Engineers and State Dam Safety Agencies, resulting in a pamphlet titled "So You Live Behind a Levee," now provided free by the IJS Anny Corps of Engineers to people with property behind levees.

In 2008 Anderson was made a Diplomate in Geotechnical Engineering by the Academy of GeoProfessionals. He is one of 360 geotechnical engineers in the US and Canada that presently have that certification. In 2016 he was selected, along with five expert geotechnical and structural engineers, to participate in a panel discussion as the keynote event for the ASCE Geo-Structures Conference in Phoenix Arizona.

Anderson has written numerous professional publications, has actively volunteered with, and supports many professional and community organizations and youth sports.



Wayne Barton Class of June 1955



As a graduate of Taft High School, Wayne Barton became a multifaceted person: he is a recognized artist, inventor-designer, author, writer, and lecturer-teacher of woodcarving. His personal work is sought by collectors around the world. At Taft, Barton was a busy,



active student serving four years on the Student Council and on a few of its committees. He is most proud of starting the first "Big Brother, Big Sister" program at Taft with classmate Cynthia Celusta which oriented and guided the incoming freshmen

to the school. A photo of him leading one of his groups through the hallways of Taft is in the 1955 Aerie Yearbook. He played four years on the basketball team, track team, and bowling team, and even found time to set pins at the Edison Park Bowl. Barton gratefully attributes and recognizes the encouragement given to his artistic abilities by Mrs. Helen F. Suter, his most understanding homeroom teacher, and Mrs. Dorothy Jordon, his keen-eyed art instructor.

Barton is the only American artist invited to exhibit his style of work in the Swiss National Museum in Zurich, Switzerland. He has authored eight books on woodcarving, published and sold in six countries. He has designed and manufactured specific tools for woodcarving and invented two new artistic fonts in the field of calligraphy including a foliated alphabet. He has lectured at the Chicago Art Institute, taught at the Chicago School of Woodcarving, and founded and directed the Alpine School of Woodcarving, Ltd.

Barton has contributed to his community and country as a veteran serving in the U.S. Coast Guard and was awarded citations for life saving while stationed on the Chicago Harbor light and the Toledo Harbor light.

He attended Wright Junior College and Illinois State University. However, following his true passion for woodcarving, first wakened at the age of five by his grandfather, he traveled to Europe to start formal training and studies in the art of woodcarving and design in Brienz, the famous woodcarving center in the Swiss Alps, under the tutelage of known masters of the day.

Although He has been awarded first place in every competition entered, Barton's focus has always been on teaching and sharing his woodcarving knowledge with others. While versed in all disciplines of carving, he specializes in the decorative form of carving known as chip carving or *kerbschnitzen* (notch and/or groove carving) in the Germanic countries of Europe. Besides teaching at colleges, schools, institutions, and organizations across the United States, he has also taught in Canada, Switzerland, and Norway. Several instructional videos may be found on YouTube.

In 2005, Fox Chapel Publishing named Barton Woodcarver of the Year. He has appeared on The American Woodshop with Scott Phillips and The Woodwright's Shop with Roy Underhill, both on PBS. For forty years he has been a contributing columnist for *Chip Chats*, the National Wood Carvers Association publication, sharing his knowledge with carvers worldwide. Today, he is still carving and sharing, successfully following his dream.

James Kepner, MS, PhD Class of June 1961



James Kepner's Taft activities included the National Honor Society, Future Teachers of America, Business Manager and Science Club.

Over the following decades, he has received awards for singularly best performance on the PhD Qualifying Exam (1977), on the



PhD Comprehensive Exam (1978), and Outstanding Graduate Student award at The University of Iowa (1979).

After joining the faculty at St. Cloud State University in Minnesota, Kepner received the SCSU Achievement

Award for outstanding contributions to the University (1985), as well as the 1991 SCSU Outstanding Faculty Award for "substantive contributions in improving the mathematics and statistics programs, commendable scholarly activity, and development of a national reputation as a statistician", and was a multiple year recipient of the Distinguished Teaching Award.

While teaching at the University of Florida (1979-1983 and 1995-2002), Kepner engaged in research both as Co-Principal Investigator of the Children's Oncology Group (COG) Research Data Center and Principal Investigator of the COG Research Data Center. In that capacity, study designs he created for use in the medical setting of controlled clinical trials are now applied in vastly different settings worldwide, such as quality control sampling in virtually any industry and survey sampling.

Kepner joined the American Cancer Society's National Home Office and Emory University in Atlanta, GA from 2005-2010 serving as Director, Division of Biostatistics/ Evaluation (2005-2006), Vice President, Statistics and Evaluation Center (2006-2010), and Adjunct Professor, Department of Biostatistics, Rollins School of Public Health (2006-2010).

Kepner has served as Treasurer of two churches as well as serving on church councils. Several university funds and the American Cancer Society have benefited from his generous contributions both financial and of his time.

Gail Niwa, MFA Class of 1975



The daughter of professional musicians, Gail Niwa began piano studies with her mother and made her orchestral debut with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra at age eight. She earned her Bachelor and Master of Music degrees on scholarship at the Juilliard School.



Niwa was an accomplished pianist who won numerous international awards and competitions including first prize at the Washington International Competition in 1987 and subsequent Kennedy Center debut, and Best Accompanist award at the 1986

Tchaikovsky Competition for violinists in Moscow.

In 1991 Niwa created a sensation by becoming the first woman ever to win the Gold Medal at the Gina Bachauer International Piano Competition. She was also awarded the Audience Prize and the Chamber Music Prize. She also won major prizes in the International Chopin Competition, the Mae Whitaker Competition, and the Washington International Competition.

Among her recordings were the Saint-Saen's finale from "Carnival of the Animals" for Disney's Fantasia 2000 soundtrack, "Music for Bassoon, Piano and Cello" CD in 1995, and recordings under the Musical Heritage Society and Teldec labels. She won major prizes in the International Chopin Competition, the Mae Whitaker Competition and the Washington International Competition as well as the Audience Prize and the Chamber Music Prize.

Niwa was the founder and artistic director of Chamber Music at Great Gorge in northwestern New Jersey. The organization's purpose is to bring chamber music concerts at affordable prices with leading professional musicians from around the country. The organization also sponsors a school outreach program where musicians perform and interact with elementary students.

Niwa was an avid tennis player during her years at Taft and became a two-time Chicago City Parks tennis champion. Her late brother David Niwa (Class of 1981) was also a skilled violinist with degrees from the Curtis Institute and The Juilliard School and served as assistant concertmaster of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra. Niwa died in February 2021.

James Schroeder, MS, DDS Class of June 1967



James Schroeder participated in many Taft activities. He joined the swim team, became captain of the varsity football team, was in the Lettermen's Club, Ski Club, and contributed to Aerie and Ibid. He also became a captain of thirty lifeguards on Lake Michigan.

Following graduation,



Schroeder went to Luther College and later enrolled in the Virginia Commonwealth University School of Dentistry where he earned his DDS and a master's degree in biochemistry.

Remaining in Virginia, Schroeder completed his residency at the University of Virginia, then opened his private dental practice in Richmond where he served his patients for 40 years. He was well known for increasing access to care for patients with special needs leaving a lasting impact on the Richmond dental community. He supplied hundreds of hours in donated time making sure those who are the poorest receive the same dental care as everyone else. He worked many hours with the Gullah community in Virginia

Schroeder was a co-founder and provider for CrossOver HealthCare Ministry, adjunct faculty at VCU from 1979-2017 and frequently contributed to the Virginia Dental Journal. He wrote fervently on the importance of leadership, relationship building and lifelong learning and growth.

Schroeder became a sought-after consultant through his firm, Leadership by Design. Orchestrating a group of dentists under the organization known as Central Virginia Dental Care was a recent passion. His friends, colleagues and clients characterized him as a catalyst for change, forever insightful and compassionate. He dedicated 13 years to serving on the Chesterfield County School Board, as well as teaching Sunday school at Redeemer Lutheran Church for 25 years.

Jim used his leadership skills to contribute to the development of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church/Child Development Center in Midlothian. Amid staying active in the community, Schroeder made sure to keep his marriage, family, and relationships at the center of his life. He said, "Looking back, I really see all sorts of interventions of God giving me the wisdom to make good choices."

Schroeder died in January 2020.

Dale Schunk, MEd, PhD Class of June 1964



Dale Schunk's many activities at Taft included the National Honor Society, Honor Club, Math Club, Business Manager, Hall Guard, Honor Club, Teacher Helper, and the Taft Football Team. Following graduation, he enrolled at the University of Illinois earning his BS in psychology. He went on to earn his MEd at Boston




on to earn his MEd at Boston University in 1974, and a PhD in educational psychology in 1979 at Stanford University. He was a captain in the U.S. Air Force serving from 1968 to 1974, earning the U. S. Forces Europe: Joint Service Commendation Medal.

As an educational psychologist, Schunk teaches graduate courses in learning and motivation and undergraduate courses in learning and educational psychology. He has researched the effects of social and instructional variables on cognition, learning, selfregulation and motivation. He has served on the editorial boards of journals such as Contemporary Educational Psychology and Educational Psychology Review. He has authored more than 120 journal articles and book chapters on educational psychology. In addition to other books, he is author of the widely used textbook, Learning Theories: An Educational Perspective, and coauthor of Motivation in Education: Theory Research and Applications.

Before moving to Purdue University in 1993, Schunk taught educational psychology at the University of Houston from 1979 to 1985 and at UNC-Chapel Hill from 1986 to 1993. He received the Albert J. Harris Research Award from the International Reading Association (1989), an Early Contributions Award from Division 15 (Educational Psychology) of the American Psychological Association (1982), and the Fulbright Distinguished American Scholar Award (1997).

For 10 years he was Dean of the UNCG School of Education. His awards include the Senior Distinguished Research Scholar Award (UNCG School of Education), the Award for Outstanding Contributions (American Educational Research Association Studying and Self-Regulated Learning Special Interest Group), and inclusion in *Who's Who in America*.


