**051/2022** Bramford/Twinstead Reinforcement – Update from Cllr P. Collett & Cllr S. Bolter The PC has submitted its response to National Grid's consultation. In summary, the PC's response reluctantly accepts the need for a substation but stresses the need for adequate and effective screening of the completed installation and draws attention for the need for consideration of residents during the construction phase. A planning application in respect of the proposed substation has now been submitted to BDC. PC to consider, discuss and provide their comments to BDC.

**RESOLVED**: No objection, however, the PC make the following comments:

The PC question why the application was validated in its current form - the drawings do not appear totally accurate, and there is no scale bar, so it is difficult to ascertain the likely impact on neighbouring properties. The building subject to the application appears to be a very large shed/workshop, within a relatively small external residential space. This is likely to impact on neighbours. The PC suggests the impact of the structure could be reduced by redesigning the roof to be flat, thus reducing the bulk of the building.

The drainage strategy needs to be confirmed and should not impact on neighbouring properties. Does the proposed building require building control approval given its size and its nature of being more than a 'garden shed'?

• Highways – Cllr D. Smith & Cllr P. Collett

SID Audley End - The unit still needs some adjustment as it only operates if a vehicle is travelling above 40 mph. The PC will continue to attempt to make contact with ECC Highways to resolve this matter. SID Sudbury Road - The PC has made an application to ECC for a new sign. The PC will contact Cllr Schwier in an effort to secure funding for the new installation.

Community Speed Watch - We are awaiting to be informed of the dates for further training and a "live" Speedwatch.

Cllr A. Cooper reported that residents have raised the issue of remedial road repairs being necessary at the Audley End area of the village. The Clerk to write to ECC Cllr P. Schwier (Peter Collett to supply details)

### • **Passenger Transport** – Cllr S. Bolter

F 315 bus

The bus service was severely disrupted by broadband works, the remedial works to stop Sudbury Road falling into the Wickham Brook, and Covid19.

We are returning to normal in other ways, the service is still very underused. <u>USE IT OR LOOSE IT</u>. If you do not support it when you can now, it may not be there if you need it in the future. Having a coffee while you wait for the next bus home is cheaper than using petrol or diesel to go by car.

The last bus into Sudbury is 6:49pm, returning at 7:15pm. The last bus each way has to be booked. All others are hail and ride. The timetable on the Gestingthorpe PC Website gives earliest departure times, that is the time you should be at the stop not to miss the next bus. Buses towards Sudbury can be 15 minutes later than that if they have had to call at both Pebmarsh and Great Maplestead on their way from Halstead.

Do not use the ECC website or phone apps that take their information from it. You are likely to miss the bus if you do not look at all, the small print. ECC ignore information sent to them by me and the operator. It is as if ECC want the route to fail.

The Parish News information was useful, but the latest version seems to be a trimmed down version of a very old ECC timetable. I repeat, use the Parish Council website.

Stansted Airspace

Last year I attended a preliminary meeting aimed to ascertain what local people wanted, with discussion followed by questionnaires. Results indicated that number of people overflown was an important parameter, making it preferable to concentrate large numbers of flights over narrow corridors oner the countryside, rather than spreading them over larger areas. even though my written response tried to counter this by reemphasizing that overflying is more intrusive over otherwise quiet rural areas than over busy urban areas, It seemed pretty hopeless, but I had missed one factor, which came to our rescue. In our areas planes are

It seemed pretty hopeless, but I had missed one factor, which came to our rescue. In our areas planes are relatively low a long way from the airport. The proposed new routes through the airspace will avoid Gestingthorpe. We must hope that the latest

proposals are accepted when the overall airspace for the main "London" airports is finalised. No new Rail news

I walked the Playing Field yesterday morning. It looked spectacularly beautiful, with the new boundary posts looking superb. Thank you to David for organising such a capable firm to do the work.

N.B Four posts remain at Hill Farm. While I am happy to store them, it would be far better to use them for their intended purpose before they get lost or forgotten.

The Cricket Club had mowed around the huts and pavilion and under the trees along the Sudbury Road, where the tractor mower cannot pass.

Branches from trees droop over the Playing Field along the eastern boundary.

One chestnut tree along the Sudbury Road has dead twigs in its uppermost branches—which is a matter for long term concern. The tree planted to commemorate Lauren Hammond looks well.

Joshua Layzell was cutting the children's area. He raised the issue of the best way to keep the area around the new posts tidy was to spray a small amount of weed killer.

## • Village Hall – Cllr C. Craig

Following on from my update at the Annual Village Meeting last month, I can confirm that work has now begun to replace the slate roof on the village hall. Scaffolding will be up for the duration, and Border roofing are stripping the roof, keeping the slates that are reusable to put on the front of the roof, and replacing where needed elsewhere with Spanish slates. We hope this will mean the village hall roof will remain in good working order for another 100 years plus.

The village hall committee continue to plan future events, including a summer party, race night and community ventures with the Parish Council and Church, in particular the Jubilee celebrations in early June. Penny Bagby, Steph Prior and myself have started a village hall garden spruce up, removing the old weed membrane and adding compost, cutting back shrubs and sweeping the paving. We plan to plant up the garden with suitable plants to make the space brighter and more welcoming. We would welcome the donation of garden compost and red, white and blue flowers! We would like to also thank Peter Nice for the loan of wheelbarrows and other equipment as well as taking away the pruning's for us.

As noted previously, as a committee, we would like to see the village hall become more of a community hub than a 'space for hire'. The coffee mornings are being well supported, and it's great to see Nic Smith's exercise classes in the hall continue to be so popular. However, we need more events like this! With more children in the village, we would like to see a parent and toddler group, plus other informal community groups use the village hall.
