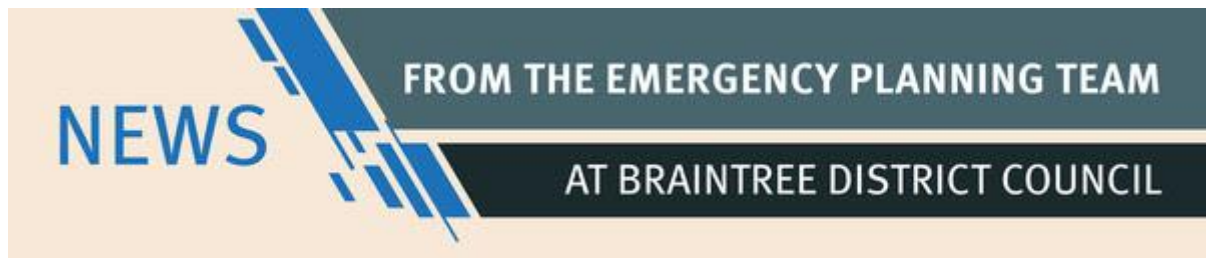

Prepare but don't panic! Emergencies are unlikely but they can happen, and with a few small steps you can prepare for the unexpected.

How to be prepared for a power cut



Power cuts don't happen very often, but sometimes they happen unexpectedly.

It's worth being prepared if this does happen to you, so here's some useful advice to help:

- Call 105 free of charge - they'll put you through to your local network operator who can give you help and advice
- Check your trip switch. If it's still on, call UK Power Networks or visit their [website](#) to see if they are aware of a power cut at your address. If the trip switch is off, try switching it

back on. If it switches off again, one of your appliances may be faulty, so unplug all appliances and then reset the trip switch

- Sign up to [UK Power Network's Priority Services Register](#) if you or someone you know needs extra support or additional care
- Consider an [emergency home kit](#) with things such as a torch, radio, first aid kit, water, toiletries, tinned or packed food, spare batteries etc
- if your fridge or freezer has not been working for more than four hours, throw away the food inside, throw away ice cream if it has gone soft and meat and fish that are still below 8°C can be cooked and refrozen, or cooked and eaten

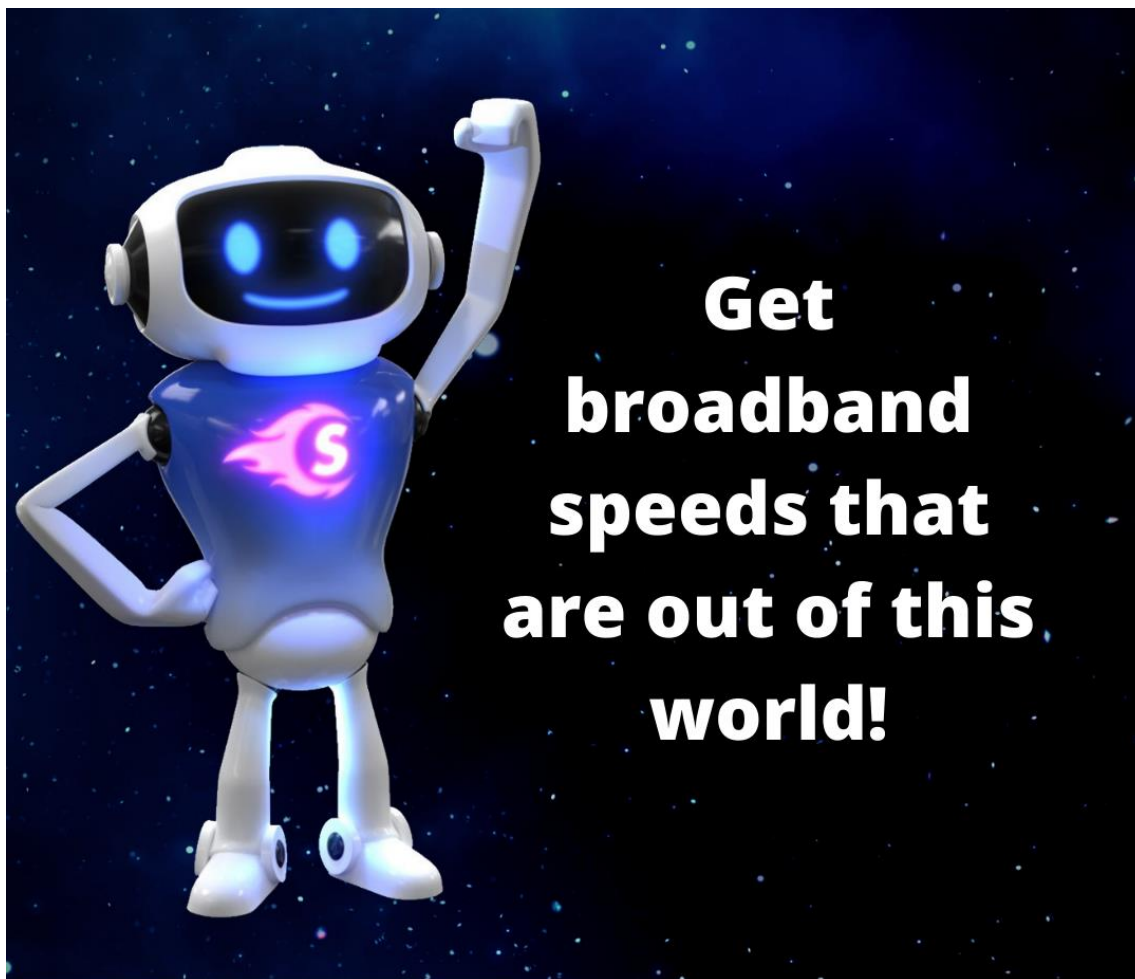

Faster internet services are coming to our district



Thanks to Essex County Council's broadband improvement programme, Superfast Essex, residents and businesses in our district are able to benefit from faster internet speed.

We are working with Essex County Council to roll out ultrafast broadband and are proud to offer download speeds of up to 1Gbps through fibre-to-the-premises (FTTP) technology.

This technology is already available to more than a quarter of premises across our district, as a result of the work of the Superfast Essex programme and commercial (non-state funded) rollouts. This is due to increase, in line with the government's ambition for gigabit-capable broadband to be available nationwide by 2030.

You can visit Superfast Essex's [interactive map](#) to find out your broadband status, and if you can already access a full fibre service, contact your internet service provider as you may need to upgrade their contract to access faster, gigabit-capable speeds.

It is not too late to get your Covid-19 vaccine.

Christ Church Clinic in Braintree offers a walk-in vaccination clinic every Monday, Tuesday or Thursday from 10am to 1pm or 3pm to 6pm.

From this week, people aged 75 and over, and people aged 12 and over who are immunosuppressed, are now eligible for a Spring Covid-19 booster vaccine.

The NHS will contact eligible people to book their next vital vaccination.

Councils working together to support Ukrainian arrivals

At a Full Council meeting on Monday, 28 March, all four political Group Leaders at our council expressed their support for the people of Ukraine and are ready to work with partner agencies to provide support to those affected by the war.

We are working alongside partners, including Essex County Council, to provide support to those arriving under the [Homes for Ukraine](#) scheme, a scheme that invites residents to apply to sponsor a named Ukrainian and their immediate family to come over to the UK, as long as they can provide accommodation for at least six months.

We will be supporting the home check process through home visits, which will work alongside the DBS and safeguarding checks to provide assurance for sponsors and guests.

We have also worked with ECC to put together local welcome packs for sponsors and their guests, highlighting the wide range of support available in the Braintree district and across Essex, including mental health support, help with finances and benefits, applying for school places and accessing NHS services. From today (1 April 2022) Covid-19 testing in England will no longer be free of charge for everyone.

Free Covid-19 testing will only be available for:

- patients in hospital
- people most at risk from Covid-19
- people living or working in high risk settings

Most visitors to adult social care settings, the NHS, hospices, prisons or places of detention will no longer require a test.

If you don't pay by Direct Debit, further details will be given in May to arrange how the rebate will be paid to you.

You do not need to do anything to receive the rebate. We will contact you if you are entitled to it.


The Additional Relief Fund business rates support package is still open to applications.

This business support package, worth £2.9 million, seeks to help businesses affected by the pandemic, but who have been unable to benefit from existing support linked to business rates. This relief is for businesses outside the retail, hospitality and leisure sectors.

The scheme, in-line with government guidance, will support a wide range of businesses. Businesses must occupy property on which it pays business rates to be eligible.

New guidance released for businesses on living with covid

The UK Health Security Agency has set out new [public health principles for workplaces](#) for businesses, organisations and employers in England. The new guidance aims to help employers to manage the risk to their workforce from respiratory infections such as COVID-19.

The new guidance has set out a number of actions for businesses in order to help reduce the spread of infections, including ensuring adequate ventilation and encouraging vaccinations. Whilst not every employer will still have to consider Covid-19 explicitly in their risk assessment, employers should continue to comply with their legal obligations to their staff. Free Covid-19 tests are no longer available for the general public, but a number of groups will still be able to obtain them.

Anyone with a positive Covid-19 test result is advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is the most infectious period.

Following the AGM at the beginning of the week, Councillor Andrew Hensman has been announced as our new Chairman. He has been a councillor since 2015.

Cllr Mrs Diana Garrod has been elected as Vice-Chairman.

Cllr Hensman will be focusing his civic year on meeting individuals, communities and businesses, as well as promoting the aims and values of the Council in communities.

The Chairman chose not to announce his charities at the beginning of the year, and instead opted to fundraise throughout the year and make donations to charities and communities he visits to allow chances for emerging causes.

Cllr Hensman is thought to be the first publicly autistic council chairman in the UK, and he hopes to inspire others, especially from the autistic community, that with the right support and greater understanding, they too can achieve great things.

Our outgoing Chairman of the Council, Cllr Sue Wilson attended 65 engagements in the local community and raised money for local charities.

Great British Spring Clean clear up of A120



Recently, the Great British Spring Clean 2022 returned for its seventh year, and the message was simple; take part in Keep Britain Tidy's 'One Bag – Big Difference' campaign and pledge to pick up as much litter as you can during the campaign.

We would like to say "*Thank you*" for taking part and to everyone who continues to help keep our district clean all year round, for all to enjoy.

Keep Britain Tidy recently announced that nearly half a million bags - 449,406 to be precise - were pledged by local authorities and community volunteers across the nation.

We did our bit by deep cleansing our district's eight-mile stretch of the A120 from the Felsted slip roads to Marks Farm roundabout, via Galley's Corner.

Weekend overnight working involving traffic management, 10 members of council staff litter-picked the verges and central reservation, as well as mechanical sweepers clearing over 17 tonnes of road-sweepings from the dual carriageway.

Three tonnes of rubbish were collected including 110 bags of general litter, vehicle debris, road-killed wildlife, wooden pallets, fences and planks, arm-chair cushions, a large dog bed, a roll of old carpet, a food waste recycling bin and even a blue wheelie bin!

It currently costs local tax payers, £1.54 million to keep our district clean and tidy. The deep-cleansing of the A120 which takes place three times a year costs a total of around £75k a year alone.

If you see someone throwing litter from a vehicle, please let us know and our Street Scene Enforcement Team will always follow it up!
