



High Grass and Weeds can pose a fire hazard, block visibility for drivers, provide a home for unwanted pests and are an eyesore. City ordinances that require lawns and lots to be mowed below 12 inches.



Trash, Junk and Debris can be dangerous or hazardous, such as old appliances, furniture, car parts, and tires and should never be stored outside. All items must be properly stored or disposed of.



Dumping garbage and other unwanted items into a ditch, a vacant lot, along a road or in someone else's dumpster is illegal.



Garbage, Recycling and Yard Carts are required to be stored where they can't be seen from the public street when standing in front of a residence. Carts can be set out as early as 6 p.m. the night before your scheduled pickup day and stored again by midnight of your pickup day.



Bulk Waste Place it at the curb no earlier than 6 p.m. the Friday before your assigned week and no later than 7 a.m. Monday of your assigned bulk collection week. Bulk waste piles are limited to 10 cubic yards — roughly the size of a Volkswagen Beetle— and are for items that are too large or heavy to fit in a garbage cart.



Zoning Issues Operating a business in a residential district, right of way encroachment, excessive garage sales and fence violations, are frequent city ordinance violations. Ensure the health, safety and general welfare of residents by observing the acceptable land use guidelines for residential, commercial and industrial zoned property.



Do Not 'Tether' Your Pet It's against the law to use a chain, rope, tether, leash, cable or other device to attach a pet to a stationary object or trolley system. Owners must keep pets within a secure enclosure and isolate them from the public and other animals.



Take Proper Care of Your Pet Owners must provide proper care — wholesome food and water in clean containers, sanitary shelter that protects pets from the elements and appropriate veterinary care. Pets cannot be confined in a parked/standing vehicle when weather conditions make it dangerous for the animal.



Vaccinations All pets living in Fort Worth are required to have a current rabies vaccination. The tag must be displayed on the pet's collar or harness. Pets are required to have a current rabies vaccination by the age of 4 months and receive a booster 12 months later. Shots then must be kept up to date.



Bandit Signs create traffic hazards, make mowing right of ways difficult and often become litter that blights neighborhoods. These signs are prohibited by city ordinance, but yet more than 30,000 are removed from public streets each year. For each violation, a citation carries a fine of up to \$500.

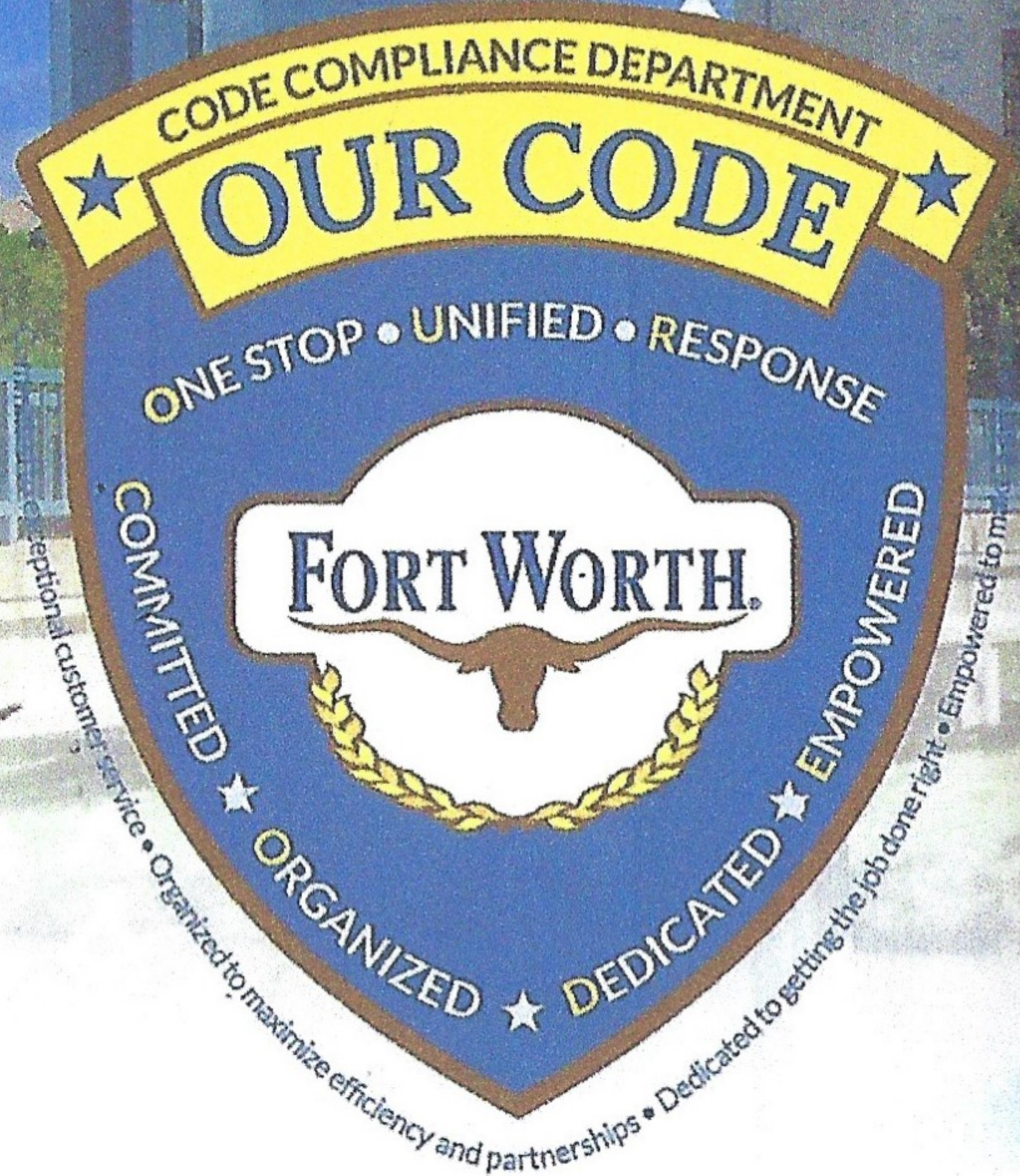


Substandard Buildings endanger the life, health and safety of those living in or working around them. Ensure homes, apartments and commercial buildings meet the Minimum Building Standards Ordinance. If a violation is not corrected, a citation can be issued.



Open and Vacant Structures provide opportunities for illegal activities, a home for vagrants and rodents. You must secure your vacant building.
