Teen Summer Theater policy requires each student participant to raise money for the show through the sale of sponsorships and tickets. During the early years of the program, funds raised by the performers, musicians and the production staff defrayed the cost of the show.

In 1975, the productions were moved into the Schreiber High School Auditorium. The larger facilities available there permitted Pam and Ron Meadows more flexibility in presenting the show and, more importantly, allowed a greater number of Teens to take part in the production. Unfortunately, the new facilities resulted in a large-scale increase in operating expenses. As a result, the Summer Show, which had operated on a break-even basis in the early years, began to run a deficit.

In 1977, a group of Friends, Parents and Alumni conducted a Fund-Raising Campaign to help sustain the production. These funds made up the operating deficit for a while. Unfortunately, costs continued to mount and the losses widened. By the spring of 1980, it became apparent that the Teen Summer Theater would have to be discontinued due to large debts and further projected increases in costs. When this prospect became known, a second and more ambitious Campaign was organized to provide financial support to the Group.

Due to his belief in the importance of the show to the youth of the Community, Mr. Robert L. Harding, Jr. and the Harding Agency agreed to join the Play Troupe and the Adult Continuing and Community Education Program as a major sponsor of the show. Mr. Harding's contribution enabled that year's show to go on. When the production was assured, the 1980 Fund Drive proceeded to raise additional funds for debt retirement and working capital. We are pleased to acknowledge the generous support of many individuals and public-spirited businesses who contributed to this worthwhile theatrical project for teenagers, especially the Patrons whose contributions insured the success of the Drive.
