These sessions are presented in both Spanish and English. During our sessions, staff support children in furthering skills to help resolve their conflicts. A daily lesson is available outlining the activities for each day. In addition, story time is offered 3 times per

week. ISP will continue our monthly newsletter, and update our social media, to stay in touch with you! Please join us!

If your child enrolled with us January 1 - March 15, please expect to receive their progress report next week.

ISP will be holding its Spring Book Fair April 20 – 30! We will be working with Melissa Miller, at Usborne Books, to bring you this exclusive online opportunity. Let's all read more! 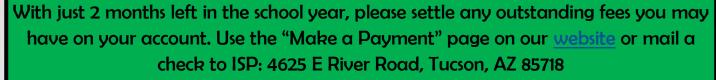

# LIMIT THE SUN BUT NOT THE FUN!

### Use Sunscreen Every Day!



Even on cloudy days, the sun's rays can damage your skin. Wear sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher. Apply 10 minutes before going outside and reapply every 2 ½ hours or sooner if perspiring or engaging in water activities. Wearing sunscreen every day is as important as brushing your teeth!

### Wear a Wide-Brimmed Hat and Lip Balm!



A hat with a wide brim offers better protection for your scalp, ears, face and the back of your neck than a baseball cap or visor. Remember to protect lips with SPF 15+ lip balm.

### Wear Sunglasses!



Sunglasses reduce sun exposure that can damage your eyes and lead to cataracts. Check the label and choose sunglasses that block at least 90% of UVA and UVB rays.

#### Cover Up!



Wear long sleeves and pants if possible to protect your skin when playing or working outdoors. Darker colors and fabric with a tight weave provide the most protection.

### Limit Time in the Midday Sun!

Limit your outdoor activities when the UV rays are strongest and most damaging (10 a.m. to 4 p.m.). Remember: Look for your shadow—if no shadow, seek cover!

#### Take Cover!



Find something fun that doesn't involve exposure to direct sun. Take cover under a tree, ramada or find an indoor activity inside a gym, library or classroom during peak UV.

#### Check the daily UV Index!



Did you know you can check the intensity of the sun's rays every day? The ultraviolet or UV index is a way of measuring the sun's intensity. The scale is from 1 to 10. The higher the UV, the more careful you should be. A day with a UV rating of 10 requires more protection than a day with a rating of 1.

Speaking of lessons, I have decided to keep my lesson plans' content untouched but with a twist. I have planned

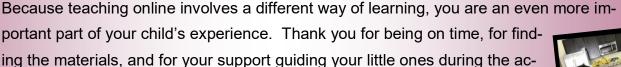

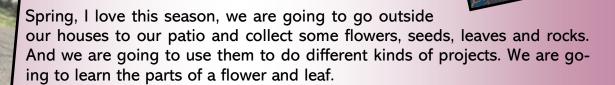
# 3's & 4's Language Enrichment with Ms. Lydia

We started a new month in a different way than usual. We welcome April through our

screens... For a lot of us this is not the ideal way to teach preschoolers, but we think that for now this is the safest and best way to provide our students and their families with meaningful and fun learning experiences. The themes for this month are:

Spring (weather, garden, insects)

During my sessions I will present activities where my students can practice their Spanish using new and already learned vocabulary. We will also play games, like guessing and memory games.
