

A Note From Pima County Health Department

Everyday steps to stay healthy and to prevent or lessen the impact of Influenza (Flu):

- Wash your hands often and thoroughly sing happy birthday twice
- Cough or sneeze into your elbow or shirt sleeve
- Use a tissue, throw it away and then wash your hands
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth
- Skip the quick hug or embrace when greeting your old friend

Flu viruses can spread from person to person through coughing, sneezing, by touching something with flu viruses on it, and in some cases through the air

Steps to take if you or someone in your family gets the flu:

- STAY HOME if you are sick stay home from work or school
- CALL FIRST call your medical practitioner or clinic BEFORE you leave the house
- MAKE A PLAN consider actions to take care of you and your family

Healthy Eating


Get your child on the path to healthy eating.

- Offer a variety of healthy foods.
 Choose foods from each MyPlate food group. Pay attention to dairy foods, whole grains, and vegetables to build healthy habits that will last a lifetime.
- Be mindful of sweet drinks and other foods. Offer water instead of sugary drinks like regular soda and fruit drinks. Other foods like hot dogs, burgers, pizza, cookies, cakes, and candy are only occasional treats.
- Focus on the meal and each other.
 Your child learns by watching you. Let your child choose how much to eat of foods you provide. Children copy your likes, dislikes, and your interest in trying new foods.
- Be patient with your child. Children
 enjoy food when eating it is their own
 choice. Some new foods take time.
 Give a taste at first and wait a bit. Let
 children serve themselves by taking
 small amounts. Offer new foods many
 times.

I hope you enjoyed a beautiful winter vacation with your family and friends. I'm excited to start a new year full of fun activities and beautiful experiences!



Welcome back Luca Caballero, we missed you!

Our themes for January are: Winter, peace and trees. The children will be learning about the coldest season by taking a look at winter clothing, changes that occur during the season, and winter sports. Throughout the unit, the children will develop an awareness of winter activities. Some of our learning experiences related to winter will include experiencing ice in the sensory table and studying animals that hibernate such as chipmunks, bears, snakes, turtles and frogs.





Spanish Vocabulary:

Trees, trees, trees!

Did you ever stop to think what our world would be like without trees? Through participating in the experiences provided by this theme, the children will learn: parts of the tree, care of trees, and how trees

help us. In our class we will use wood blocks to build houses, chairs, tables and all kinds of other objects. We will also talk about foods that grow on trees. Some of the activities to support this theme are: going on a "tree walk" and recording the number of trees we see, as well as cooking experiences with foods from trees (fruit salad). Our drama center will be transformed into a "construction site. Also, we will use real tree branches to paint at the easel.

During circle time we will continue working on colors (Azul, Amarillo, Rojo, Morado, Negro, Blanco, Verde, Rosa, Plata, Cafe, Gris), Numbers 1-10, and shapes (Heart: Corazon; Square: Cuadrado; Star: Estrella; Circle: Circulo)



In this month we will focus on PEACE, conflict resolution and kind acts.

We will introduce in our classroom "The Peace Table". The Peace Table allows a child to have a short

period of silence on their own. A Peace Table can also be used by the children to encourage conflict resolution through peaceful and respectful communication.



When used for conflict resolution, it encourages children to talk about what's on their mind and gives them a specific place and method to achieve an agreeable solution. Feel free to visit our classroom and take a look at our beautiful peace table.
