October went by so fast! It was such a fun month filled with pumpkins and lots of orange.

November brings us chilly weather and that means SWEATER WEATHER! Please change your child's

clothes for more weather appropriate clothing.

Our themes for this month are Thanksgiving, corn, traditions, holidays, giving and kindness. Themes will be emphasized with books, arts & crafts, and songs.

On November 1st, "Día de los Muertos" is observed all over Latin America. The children will learn why it's more of a celebration of life, we will create a calavera (skull) as a class and make individual marigold flowers.

We will explore corn in our sensory bin with scoopers and paint with corn on the cob. During our circle time we will talk lots about what it means to give, how giving makes us feel and

how it relates to kindness.



Thanksgiving brings our families together to share food and laughter; we will explore what is typically served for dinner that holiday and what vegetables or fruits were harvested and

used to make those dishes. Our dramatic area will be turned into a Pie Stand where the children will get to create their own Thanksgiving pies.

We will be traveling around the world with the help of songs and books and learning about how others celebrate holidays and traditions. If your family has a unique tradition that you'd like to share or if you play a

I want to welcome Cosme Flores to our class! Bienvenida Cosme, we will have many adventures together.

During this month we will continue working on self-care skills. Enabling children to develop skills in self care helps promote independence and supports children in taking responsibility for their own health and well being, as well as promoting the person-centered values of independence. Children love being independent and they

feel happy and confident when they accomplish self-care tasks.

Self help skills may include learning to put on your own shoes and outerwear, identifying personal items and taking care of them, participating in classroom cleanup, helping to set the snack and lunch table, and tending to our bathroom needs.

The temperature is getting colder, so please remove the warm weather clothing in your child's cubby and replace it with colder weather clothing. If you receive a

pink slip on your sign in page, please check the "soiled clothing " bin found outside our classroom and remove the bag labeled with your child's name. If your child is still having accidents, please be sure you provide 2-3 sets of extra clothing.

November learning themes include kindness, traditions and festivities around the world, corn, and gardening.


