## Younger 2's Partial Spanish Immersion

Queridas Familias,

October was filled with so much fun and joy! Thank you to everybody who supported us this month at our fall festival, I was so happy to see most of my kids there enjoying decorating their pumpkins. In class we have continued to practice class rules and routines. Their patience and willingness to participate and follow directions at mealtimes has really impressed me, and I am very proud of their progress.

November is one of my favorite times of year, we are very excited to experience the

changing of the weather and enjoy this month's festive themes.

Sofia Wintzer for gifting us a bag of soil for our garden, we appreciate it so much!

Our first theme this month will be the season of Fall. We are going to be collecting a variety of leaves from outside and observing them with a magnifying glass. I will teach the kids how leaves change colors and fall off trees during this season and use real leaves to show them how the color changes as they dry out.



Our second theme is going to be Corn. At our sensory table we will be peeling the husk off ears of corn. We will then be removing the corn from the cobs and transferring the kernels into different containers by pouring. This will be to work on coordination and motor skills.

Our third theme will be November Holidays and Traditions. We will be discussing the Mexican holiday of Day of the Dead and the traditions that are associated with it. We will also be discussing the Thanksgiving Holiday,

and the foods that we enjoy during thanksgiving dinner. We will spend some time giving thanks to what we are grateful for.

Our last theme of the month will be the theme of Giving. They will learn that giving to others can not only make them happy, but make you feel happy as well. Giving thanks will also be something that we explore. I have

The children planted pumpkin and wildflowers seeds in the garden last month. Now we are watering, weeding, and watching the newly grown sprouts. We also closely observe Rosie, our sweet potato that is inside our classroom. We are so excited to see the roots and leaves sprouting.

We will create a Altar de los Muertos for Dia de los Muertos. Your child is invited to bring in pictures of your loved ones that have passed away. Please feel free to include pets. I realize this may be a sensitive topic for some children so discussions will be handled mindfully. Participation is optional.

"Giving" will be a topic for November. Our school will be hosting a donation drive for Pima Paws for Life animal shelter. Your child may donate the requested item to the box outside our classroom beginning November 1. A list of the requested items will be displayed on the box. Thank you.

I'm very thankful to all families for your support in helping me to create a positive learning environment. Your wonderful book donations for our classroom were so appreciated! My gratitude to those who attended the fall festival. I enjoyed it and the kids seemed happy to see their friends and families outside of school hours.

## 4's/5's Full Spanish Immersion

#### Dear Parents and Families,

Thank you for attending and supporting our Fall Festival! It was so good to see you and I had a great time playing Bingo with all of you.

With the arrival of November, we officially welcome the season of Holidays and Traditions (that will continue next month too). We will launch this month celebrating Dia de los Muertos. Our class will create an "Altar" to remember and honor our loved ones (family members and pets) who have passed away. Children will be able to bring pictures to set on the Altar and we will make colorful artwork to decorate it. My friends will also be able to share their pictures and memories in front of the class. I will read books about this topic, and we will learn how other countries in Latin-Americans celebrate this Tradition.

We will use our senses to explore Autumn/Otono and this Holiday Season. Children will make a list of things we can see, smell, taste, hear and feel during this time of the year. Our class will also keep track of any changes in the weather that we can observe

and feel. Children are enjoying working with graphs, so we'll make one to record our observations. We will sing "Otoño Llegó" and "The Leaves on the trees."

Corn/Maíz/Choclo/Elote is another theme for this month. We will plant corn seeds in soil, sand and rocks. Children will make predictions about which one of the seeds will successfully grow. At the grassy playground we will pretend we are kettle corn popping until we become popcorn. To end this unit, we will make popcorn/palomitas de maiz and we'll read "The Popcorn Book" by Tomie de Paola.

Each year, around this time, ISP gets involved in Community Service. This year we will be supporting "Pima Paws for Life". Our class will decorate a donation box that will be

located right outside our classroom. We'll also post a list of items they need to take proper care of the animals. This is a great opportunity to get not only our students and families involved, but our extended community. It is also a learning experience for the children about "Giving". We'll talk about the concept of "Giving" and we will discuss ways we can give to others and to ourselves.

I'd like to invite all our families to visit our class and share with us holidays and traditions you observed at home. How you celebrate and embrace these special days, food you eat, music you dance and listen to. Visits can be short and simple, books, pictures, games, art projects (we can take care of that if there's not enough time), etc. If you or any other family member would like to be part of these activities, please contact me and together we can set up a good day and time for the visit.

Pre-Writing and Pre-Reading Skills: Children will continue to practice tracing, writing, and recognizing their names and friends' names. I will present the ABC's lower case for those friends who are interested in practicing it. Children will keep practicing snipping and cutting with scissors. I've noticed that my students are spending more time at the writing table making clearer and more detailed pictures!

Pre-Math Skills: We'll keep reinforcing the skills we worked on during the past few months. Also, during this month I will introduce "Addition". We'll be adding different kinds of manipulatives related to our monthly themes. Students will also sort materials by size, color, or category (farm animals and wild animals).



<ul> <li>Employ Jani King, a professional cleaning service, that cleans our campus each evening M-F. When directed they may utilize a hospital grade method of disinfecting. In the event that a hospital grade method of disinfectant needs to be used, families will be notified. The same team will clean our classrooms each evening.</li> <li>Follow current CDC/PCHD guidelines and recommendations in regard to confirmed cases of contagious diseases.</li> <li>Establish separate entry and exit points to the school and encourage directional traffic at high traffic times</li> <li>Set up hand sanitizer stations around the ISP campus for use by students, families, and staff.</li> <li>Ensure only staff and essential persons have access to classrooms at this time.</li> <li>Ensure sufficient supplies of disinfectant, tissues, masks, hand sanitizer, and gloves are available at all times.</li> <li>Establish a plan should a staff member or student display symptoms of illness during school hours. Plans may include release from school, isolation, a Dr.'s note to return, and/or mask wearing.</li> <li>Ensure regular changing of air filters in all ISP buildings.</li> <li>Post notifications for the community when a communicable disease has been confirmed and reported.</li> <li>Share community resources to access assistance and education about vaccines.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Support children who wear masks.</li> <li>Disclose to the Director should a staff member have close contact, display symptoms, or test positive.</li> <li>Design activities in the classroom environment that support physical distancing in respect to a play-based philosophy.</li> <li>Invite families to participate in outdoor activities.</li> <li>Promote, demonstrate, and reinforce healthy hygiene habits.</li> <li>Model and reinforce effective handwashing with soap and water for each child upon entry to the classroom, before/after eating, after using the bathroom, and at other times throughout the school day.</li> <li>Post lesson plans and class happenings in the windows for family viewing.</li> <li>Clean and disinfect classroom toys frequently.</li> <li>Present curriculum utilizing outdoor space as much as possible, weather permitting.</li> <li>Unless essential, discourage nap bedding from home.</li> <li>Vaccinate.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Disclose to ISP director should your child contract a communica- ble disease such as COVID19. A plan will be set into place for your child's return to school which may include recommendations of PCHD/CDC.</li> <li>Limit your time on the campus during pick up and drop off.</li> <li>Adhere to established entry and exit points.</li> <li>Ensure that your child has two spare sets of clothing at school.</li> <li>Provide the most current copy of your child's emergency infor- mation and immunization / ex- emption forms. If COVID vaccinat- ed, provide updated record.</li> <li>Monitor your child for the safe use of hand sanitizer.</li> <li>Commit to staying abreast of school communication.</li> <li>Keep sick children home and con- tact preschool office of absence.</li> <li>Ensure having a backup childcare plan should your child need to stay at home due to illness.</li> <li>Understand what personal items support a child's sense of security, ability to transition, or self- regulate and are considered es- sential.
