

Depending on the weather or number of students, you will find the entire group either on the Room 10 playground or in Room 22. Room 22 is just next to the big climber.

The lesson plan and Daily Schedule are posted on our main class bulletin board.

During the month of October, we will continue to learn routines, get comfortable in our learning environments, learn about each other, and improve in our self-help skills, all while incorporating October themes: apples, numphing form fall spider, and

pumpkins, farm, fall, spiders, and bats.

We play outdoors a lot! Please be sure your child has a light sweater or jacket for the cooler, late afternoon temperatures.



Please remember to pack and label enough food for an afternoon snack. Pack a utensil if needed. We will help children to refill their water bottles when needed.

Aftercare ends at 6pm! We appreciate your timely pick-up.

2's Partial Spanish Immersion with Ms. Maricruz, Ms. Gabby, & Ms. Holli

Hello Dear Parents,

I cannot believe we are at the end of September, the month passed so quickly! We started the month learning about dental care. We brushed, brushed, and brushed all week. Then, we learned about our families and Mexican Independence Day. We ended the month introducing the Autumn in the desert.



During the week of dental hygiene, children got to explore a scale mouth and brushed it with a huge toothbrush. They loved cleaning some small dinosaurs made of plastic with a toothbrush and soapy water. I used some of the egg cartons Debbie Kornmiller donated to brush away alphabet germs and the rest to play dentist. I stuck Play-Doh in the egg carton and the kiddos removed it with a stick (thank you Debbie!). Children had fun making a mouth with construction paper and marsh-mallows as teeth and they were amazed with the experiment: What Does Sugar Do to Our Teeth?

In this experiment, we put two eggs in two different glasses. We poured dark soda in the first glass

and commercial lemonade in the second one. We then waited for 4 days. The results were impressive: in the first glass the dark soda stained and

cracked the egg shield, the soda then got inside the egg and covered everything with a black jelly substance. In the second glass, the one with the lemonade, the egg shield develop a layer similar to dental tartar, jagged and yellowish; children were fascinated touching it! I am sure the egg experiment would be a good experience to encourage our kiddos to brush their teeth after a sugary snack.



I then, let children explore their environment with some costumes and toys. They

loved to dress up and do pretend play. With the pictures I gathered from all of you, we created a house for each family. They got very excited every time I showed the pictures in class. No matter how many times I showed the pictures, I always got faces with a wide-open smile.



During Mexican Independence Day, one of my favorite holydays, we decorated the classroom in green, white, and red in honor to the Mexican flag. We also had our first food experience: "*Aguas Frescas*," a popular Mexican drink made of fruits. Only a few children did not try the drink "Agua de Jamaica," but most of them drank the beverage and keep asking for more. They did better with the "Agua de Limon," since it was basically regular lemonade.

We ended the month with the introduction to the Autumn in the desert, windy days,

changes in the sun light, and the weather were our topic of exploration. We introduced children to gardening. September was fun and we also welcomed new children now it is time to get ready for new discoveries.

October will be full of gardening projects, math, pumpkins, and Halloween! To move forward and successfully throughout these projects, I will need your support. I will be growing microgreens and will be in need of the following supplies: potting soil, shallow containers and spray bottles. For further projects with the children, I will be collecting cardboard tubes (toilette paper, paper towels, aluminum foil, etc.). So, please do not throw them away, but bring them to Room 10. Juni's mom already brought many items to the class, thank you so much!

September was such a fun month of introducing and exploring new things! Our main theme was FAMILY. The children have really enjoyed being able to share stories of their families, pets, and places they have visited. We also focused on sharing and taking turns. I am generally pleased with the progress of my young friends.



Dental hygiene was introduced into our classroom with the children having the opportunity to paint on the easel with toothbrushes. Special thanks to Dr. Natalia Williams for the generous donation of toothbrushes. We discussed healthy food choices for our dientes/teeth.

We welcomed Ms. Nooshin into our classroom to teach us Farsi each Wednesday and Ms. Alice to teach us music alternating Tuesdays/Fridays.

On the 16th of September we observed Mexico's Independence Day by making GUACAMOLE and eating it for our snack with tortilla chips. We learned about the flag and listened to traditional Mexican music.

An introduction to gardening was made by growing a small sprout from pinto beans inside a Ziploc bag and later transitioning it into a cup. This was a great way to get the children excited about gardening which is planned for early October. We will be growing pumpkins and sunflowers.

Thank you to all the parents that came out to visit us for Parent Night. It was a great success and glad we



are all working together to encourage the children to learn and explore.

Thank you to those who came out on Spruce-Up Day to beautify our school and our classroom. Your hard work is truly appreciated.

In addition, I will continue to encourage and reinforce students to do all that they successfully do for themselves!

Our October themes will include Farm and Fall, apples and pumpkins, and bats and spiders.



Our themes will be reinforced with books, songs, art, and a variety of activities. Our farm unit will include learning the names (Spanish and English) of farm animals and identifying pictures of a variety of farm animals. We will have a farm scenario set up in dramatic play. We will do a taste test of red, yellow, and green apples to determine which we like best. We will plant pumpkins seeds in our

garden, carve a real pumpkin and taste their seeds, and lastly we will decorate pumpkins. We will learn fun facts from books about bats and spiders and create our very own spider prints! Whew – it will be a busy month!

Learning to get dressed, brushing teeth and other simple self care tasks help children develop a sense of au-

Some self care skills we

have planned: putting on shoes, help set the table, learn their own last name.

The temperature is getting colder, it's the perfect time to introduce our next unit: FALL. By participating in the experiences provided throughout this unit, children will become more aware of changes that take place in the fall and common fall activities.

Many learning experiences have been planned to promote an awareness of im-



agery that are associated with October such as pumpkins, cats, bats, and spiders.

Some of the October activities planned include: Carving a pumpkin, creating designs with pumpkin seeds and glue on paper, planting pumpkin and other seeds, and

learning about spiders and other insects. Do you know the difference between insects and spiders? Most insects have three body parts and six legs. Spiders have two body parts and eight legs. To support this theme we will create spiders out of a variety of materials in the art area.



Another unit that we will explore is Farm Animals. The children will be learning the many different ways that farm animals help us. They will also become aware of the difference between pets and farm animals.

We will continue practicing numbers 1-10 in Spanish and review vowels A and E, and introduce the letter O of Octubre = October
