Big clouser type flies, 4-6", 1/0 and 2/0, heavily weighted fished with sinking lines did the trick. White, hot pink and chartreuse yak hair, fish hair and rabbit strips all worked. John must be shy because he didn't send a picture. Tom and Jerry and fishing buddies George Bennett, Bill Locher and Terry McCormick caught dozens or hundreds of speckled trout in canals and bayous, mostly under 15" but plenty of keepers, too. Clousers and crazy charlies work—any color is good as long as it is tan and olive!







Editor's Note: Tom Finkle insisted on adding the following story about my red in the photo. Feel free to question its veracity.

"Tom and Jerry at it again. Everyone has heard about those big bull reds in the bay. Tom spent the better part of a day chasing them but was unable to get deep enough with the fly rod to hook up. A couple of days later Jerry called him and said, Want to go fishing? Silly question. It was kind of cool and the water was choppy that morning. Too rough to really see the Reds. So we made the decision to launch at Shoreline and make our way around Deer Point to Gilmore where we had pretty good fishing earlier. As we were cruising in at a good rate of speed trying to stay dry, Tom saw nervous water directly in front of us and cut the throttle and turned off the engine. No birds, no sign of fish, but it was one of those trust me things... I think I saw something! Besides, Tom said he was on a strategic course. Right! We took a couple of casts with no luck and were about to reel up when Jerry's rod obtained a very healthy bend! He was hooked up with a beauty! Took him a little while to get it close to the boat, Jerry is by no means gentle with big fish. The shooting head was just coming into the guides when Jerry says, "my reel handle is loose!" No problem says Tom. Just keep playing him. About that time Jerry says, "my reel handle fell off!" No problem says Tom, I'll collect the parts. No problem? Jerry hand stripped the brute through the rest of the battle and we boated it! We continued into Gilmore after that and caught some nice trout. A fitting end to a great day."

Fishing Report.... Captain Baz Yelverton

The hottest action for November has been the continuation of the "Running of the Bulls" in Pensacola Bay. The fish haven't been coming to the top as dependably as in the past couple years, but when you're in the right place at the right time it's outrageous! The most likely areas are between Town Point and the Gulf Breeze end of the Three Mile Bridge (includes the Dead Man's Island cove); between Joe Patti's and Muskogee Wharf (around the Port of Pensacola); in the triangle formed by the Turning Basin at NAS, the entrance channel to Bayou Grande, and Buoy 22; and finally between Town Point and Deer Point. Of course you never know when it's going to happen or where...or even IF it's going to happen on a given day. You just have to be out there ready for action hoping to get lucky.







While waiting for the big fish to hit the top I've been having some good success with slot-redfish on our favorite sand/grass flats. Poling the shallows looking for fish sure beats drifting around aimlessly waiting for the pelicans to get excited! Dave Walters landed this first fish November 2 and Mike Youkee landed and released this beauty on November 28. The "flats reds" are less spooky than earlier in the year, plus they're eagerly taking the EP gray/white #2 baitfish and the EP #2 tan/ white clouser. The water temperature in Santa Rosa

Sound is down to 58 degrees, and the fish are energized. They're charging the fly from 10' away and inhaling it...way different from the nervous fish of early-fall.

The final and equally exciting news is the fall run of false albacore is going on BIG TIME. This morning (November 30) at 8am Pickens Point was loaded with albies. There were four or five large schools of fish feeding aggressively just outside the inner bar in 2-3' of water. We ran east to the observation tower and found bunches of fish feeding all along the beach. Mike Youkee landed them on a #6 gummy minnow until he was ready to move on to another species. So we made the cardinal mistake of leaving fish to try and find other fish...and never landed anything else. There's a lesson there somewhere...
