## Ball and Chain Fly.... Matt Wegener

As some of you may know, I'm heading back to my home state of Illinois this October to get married. She truly is the woman of my dreams as she lets me fish when I want and even bought me a kayak so I could explore the waters around Pensacola. Not only has she put up with my fishing addiction, but she has "allowed" me to incorporate my love for fly tying into the wedding ceremony in the form of giving our guests hand-tied flies as a wedding favor. I think this will be a neat addition to our special day, but now I have to tie over a hundred flies in less than 2 months! Last Bull Session I requested the help of the some of the great fly-tiers we have in our club to make this job easier. I've already selected a few easy-to-tie flies that match the colors used in the wedding, but I wanted to come up with a fly that was unique and also fun for you guys to tie. While I was enjoying a free day at the bench, thanks to Hurricane Isaac, I developed the "Ball and Chain Fly". I'm not going to promise this wedding dress will catch fish, but it's a lot cheaper to tie one than it is to buy one!

### **Ingredients**

**Hook** The cheaper the better **Thread** White flat-waxed nylon

Garter Ultra chenille (color choice of the bride)

**Tail** White marabou (any color can be used if this isn't her first

time)

**Body** Pearl/white craft cord **Head** Styrofoam packing material



### Instructions



Step 1. Lay down a thread base and tie in the ultra chenille above the knee (or the bend of the hook) to form the garter.

Step 2. Tie in 2-3 plumes of marabou to form the tail. Proper ladies should never show off their undergarments, so be sure to use enough marabou to hide the garter.





Step 3. To form the head, tie in a ¼" strip of Styrofoam packing material at the eye of the hook; facing away from the hook point. Notice how the thread base is used to form the "curves" of the bride. 6/0 thread can be used if you desire less lady-lumps.

Step 4. Fold the Styrofoam packing material back over itself to finish form ing the head.






Step 5. To form the body, wrap the craft cord tightly around the hook shank being careful not to overlap each wrap. Tie off above the bosom and trim so that 1" of craft cord is left to form the right arm. Then tie another 1" piece of craft cord on the opposite side to form the left arm.



Step 6. Whip finish to complete the fly and be sure to take her somewhere nice for the honeymoon!
