## Churches Abound But the Cross is Left Behind.

It's been almost a year and we've visited six churches and even had our time of trying to start up a home church. So far, nothing satisfies our souls. We were already fed so much back in the States on "meat" that everything here is "milk."

Yesterday, we found more "sour milk." The church was full of entertainment, music, drama, dance, specials...over two hours worth. The sermon was given about 45 minutes but even some of that was taken up by a second offering. While we were very warmly welcomed and enjoyed the music, the sermon was so fraught with theological innacuracies, it would have been laughable, if not so serious.

We had been invited to this church by a new friend (another Deborah referal) and were thankful she was able to discern the problems with the message this Sunday and was gladly willing to discuss them with us. She is no longer wishes to take her family to this church.

And so now where do they go? Where can the Dominican people come together for worship, fellowship and true Bible teaching that leads to reformation? We have yet to find it. While this family would like to now meet at our house on Sundays, we don't feel the pull to try a home church again.

There are thoughts on trying to bring down a start from a church in the States (the Communion of **Reformed Evangelical Churches** denomination, aka CREC) but that's just going to take time, so we willing wait to see what He has planned. The start of such a thing would require a trip to Florida, to spend a week with a pastor and his family so we would know what we're asking for or, getting ourselves into, as they live a fellowship style that is based much more tightly than our traditional, US church set-up. Two weeks ago, Jason met with the elders at the Berean church we'd been going to. He wanted to find out how they viewed Biblical governance. It was a meeting that he went into hoping for the best, but was shown these men's allegiance is much more to the government of Dominica, than to God. They feel what they're doing is ok on the outside, but they're not internalizing the whole Bible, instead, choosing to cherry pick when it comes to the government and mandates that affect the church.

It's so disapointing to hear God's Word being preached (albeit softly) from the pulpit but then to see these same people not living out what is being preached. I struggle to understand how they can play the acting part of a leader without accepting all of the authority of their position.
