This is a huge answer to prayer but with a lot of work involved! The lower appartment hasn't been lived in for years and it's painfully obvious. With it being in such a state of disrepair and multiple unknowns, Jason decided to gut the entire thing to "start over."

In the demo process, he found crumbling support columns and terribly wired electric, amongst other things. While this time frame of this project makes me nervous, I know God brought us this blessing and He'll give us what we need to get it done. He is to be praised!

The past two weeks have seen us begin this project without help. However, Tuesday and Wednesday, God brought us Jamie, a young man just out of college, who is a great worker. He is not a Believer, so we'd ask for you all to pray for him.

Also please pray for safety during demolition, wisdom, accuracy and knowledge during reconstruction, and things to flow along quicker than we think possible to meet our deadline, the end of January.

Along with the main project, Jason offered to fix Sandy's car (so it's done right) before she arrives. It's sat in our backyard for over a year now, not running. She bought the needed parts, which should be here this week. Please pray Jason can get it in good running order for her.

Once Sandy goes back to Holland in April, we've been given permission to rent out the appartment, recouping our expenses and even bringing in a little income. We will talk more when she's here in person, but from the sound of it, her desire is for us to stay until we find a place that suits us well. God is SO good!

At the start of Club, there were only two guys, but by the end

there were eight students total, listening to Jason talk about the difference between praise and worship. (Personally, I think it was my chocolate chip cookies that brought them. ()

Some of the students just sat and listened, while a couple others moved to the front row, asked questions, had eager eyes and even stayed after trying to ask more questions. Jason and I offered our home for their Christmas Party this year. We'll see what they say.

This past Tuesday, also at the State College, Jason and Hannah visited the Debate Club. They were each allowed to join a side (opposite sides!) and helped the students debate. The topic for this meeting was "Should LGBTQIA+ have rights?" Talk about a hot button topic to come in on.
