I know this because I enjoy talking with people and I take every opportunity to get to know those around me. Most the time, those people are complete strangers, but since I'm the "white guy," it's easy to start up conversations.

As I continue to dig into Scripture, also known as Truth, it's clear to me that we are at war with the very nature of man and not a virus. The only solution is a hot Gospel and that takes bold, wise leadership.
