Notes from the Pastor's Chair

My dad was stationed in Turkey and the Philippines before I was born. My family lived at both of these locations for about two years. Over the years, I have heard many stories from my mom about their time there. Our living room was filled with things from both places. Our living room furniture was from the Philippines. We had decorative brass pieces from Turkey in the dining room. The things that I loved were the carved animals of deep dark rich wood that filled a side table in the living room. I had to oil them every week when I polished the furniture. I longed to play with them, but they were sacred items not to be played with. They were to be cherished and looked at only.

When my mom passed, they got packed into a box to decide who would receive them among the remaining children. As much as I loved them, I will give priority to my siblings who lived in the Philippines because these items represent a moment in time for them.

So, why have I told you this story? Because churches have and are sacred items or places. They are filled with touchstones that bring back specific moments in time. Each church has its own sacred items.

At my home church we had to change the carpet in the sanctuary. It had been there

since the church was built in the late 60's. It was bright red and no longer matched the tile that had been put in some time in the mid 80's. It was quite worn, and it was time. This was a painful process because that carpet was part of so many moments for people in the church. They had been married on it, their children had been baptized on it, and some of those children had grown up to be married on it as well. It was a sacred item. The carpet, this inanimate thing, took on so much emotion throughout the process. It was hard for those of us that had no attachment to it to understand.

Church is hard. In a previous article, I published a poem about all the ways that church is hard, but the biggest reason church is hard right now is that we are living in the unknown. It's not just us, the ELCA. It's all denominations. Post-COVID, the number of people attending church is not what it used to be, but those numbers have been declining for the last ten-plus years outside of rural America.

There is an organization called the Pew Research Center that puts out regular research data about Church attendance across all denominations. I have seen these reports for several years before becoming a Pastor. Yes, there was a time for the church when the pews were overflowing, the classrooms were filled, the confirmation classes were bursting, and getting volunteers was easy. I didn't experience those years. I went to military base churches, which ebbed and flowed with station changes. I attended a local Lutheran Church before the ELCA was formed, which had an average attendance of about seven kids and a Sunday class of maybe twenty to twenty-five. Our children's choir was maybe twenty to twenty-five. In high school and college, I drifted

in and out of church. (I'll save those stories for a different article.) I have only known churches this size, with limited volunteers and similar troubles.

As your Pastor, I am called to teach and preach and lead you all forward. Forward is scary because we don't know what that looks like. We don't know what it will bring. I can't tell you because I don't know either. I am here to walk with you.

I am here to love and care for you, to help you find a faithful path forward—a path that aligns with who we are as a church. That path will be different for Calvary and St. Paul. We are yoked, but the two congregations have different paths and different missions. I am here to help you identify who you are as a church, to identify that mission and help find a path to act on it. Doing this can cause some upsetting conversations. It can cause me to move some sacred items. I don't mean to upset, offend, or hurt anyone. It is the work you called me to do. It is the work we are called to do as the church. The church is not stagnant. It can't be, or it dies. The church is a living organism that changes, evolves, and adapts along the way. Each of us here is sacred, each of us here is holy, and each of us here is important to the process. I understand it's scary - I feel it, too - but let's be scared together and trust in God to walk with us.



always work in pairs, and it only takes about an hour. St. Paul is responsible for one week's deliveries every four to six weeks. When we have enough volunteers, each set of partners is responsible for one day.


WOMEN OF WORSHIP (WOW) AT ST. PAUL Wednesday, October 2nd at 11am

Chili Lunch & Fall Clean Up Day at St. Paul


Fall Clean Up Day is Sunday, October 6th! Help clean up and join us for a great bowl of chili
