Notes from the Pastor's Chair



It is hard to believe that November 4th will be the third anniversary of my ordination. I started the following Monday as your Pastor. Looking back over the last three years, I realize that my first year here was a race, and I don't feel like it stopped until sometime into my second year. The race started with graduating from Seminary in May, doing two funerals my last week at work in Omaha, moving back to KC, getting a part-time job, realizing that my mother had declined significantly, and spending every free second there all summer while navigating the call process. By mid-August, I had

quit my job and moved to my sister's couch. That is where I stayed until after her funeral in mid-September. Then the process of packing, moving, and leaving everything we had known for a long time began, along with planning an ordination and starting to serve as your Pastor.

We continue to grow new roots in the community. That work is ongoing as it always is. We love living so close to Lake Michigan, with its beauty and ever-changing scenery. Kristin loves the longer, more consistent winters (although she would like more snow that stays around—everybody picture the winters of their youth, that is what she wants). Yes, I miss my long, hot, humid summers. But I try to take advantage of every warm day we have, and I guess the decreased sun exposure is better for my skin. Both of us grew up in communities the size of Manitowoc and Two Rivers, so, in some ways, it's like returning to the cities that helped shape us.

In my time here, I have learned to love and care for each of you. I have learned to grow into this calling as your Pastor and face the challenges that it presents. It has been both a joy and a struggle at times like life. The call to ministry has been everything I thought it would be and so much more. It has also been many things that I wasn't prepared for—but once again, that is life.



Planning worship each week. Carefully thinking through what I want the service to say or do gives great joy. As does the privilege of bringing you the good news each week. As I said in a recent sermon, I couldn't have predicted the climate I would be preaching in. I always knew that preaching the gospel meant pushing people by reminding them of Jesus's words and actions. I knew that from sitting in the pews and having my mentors and formative pastors do that for me. But it feels different from the other side.



I want us to continue to grow together, learn from each other, and heal together. The road is not always easy, and we may have to make some hard decisions along the way. Still, I pray that we can make them together, keeping the greatest commandments in mind—to “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.” This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: “Love your neighbor as yourself.”

Our church is a place to hear the promise of

unconditional forgiveness, grace, mercy, and salvation, alongside our call to act faithfully to work in the world to love and care for our neighbors. How we do that will be different for each of us, but God’s call on us as believers and followers is to care for the least among us. It is a call to stand up and expect dignity and fairness for all. It is a call to welcome all to the table.

We are to steward the church towards the future, and it will look different from how it has always been. That is the scary, unsettling thing about church and the world. We don’t have to do this alone. We have each other. We have our families —our St. Paul and Calvary families — and the larger combined family of both congregations.

I look forward to next year and what it brings.

November 9th, from 3 pm to 4:30 pm at First Presbyterian. *An event titled, “Kristallnacht, A Night for Remembrance,”* is scheduled for Sunday, Nov. 9th, 2025, from 3pm to 4:30pm at First Presbyterian Church of Manitowoc. This afternoon of education and remembrance is being held on the 87th anniversary of Kristallnacht, known as “The Night of Broken Glass,” in which German militias were given official authorization to enter Jewish neighborhoods throughout the nation and destroy businesses, homes, and property belonging to Jewish individuals. Discussions will cover the political status of pre-WWII Germany and how they led up to sanctioned national violence and terror, how those conditions contrast with our current national policies, and the input and impact of religious groups in both circumstances. Speakers slated to appear are Dr. Kerry Trask, Professor Emeritus of History at the University of Wisconsin, Manitowoc, Rev. Dr. Matt Sauer, Pastor, Manitowoc Community Ministries, and Sheryle L Lyman. The event will take place in the ground-level Community Hall of First Presbyterian Church, at 501 N 8th Street, Manitowoc. Please enter through the 8th Street Entrance.

This event is designed to focus on social trends, laws, and public policies, and will steer clear of political figures or parties. There will not be a discussion period. It is designed to present information and enable attendees to draw their own conclusions.
