# Notes from the Pastor's Chair

As of this writing, there are 77 days until the election is over. I don't know about you, but I will be glad for the end of the political ads, the signs, the texts, and the mail that ends up in the recycling box. No matter what the outcome, the world will continue. That is a comforting thought amid all the fear and anxiety of the current days. What remains to be seen is the direction our world will take.

I remember voting in my first election when I was 18 years old. Several months earlier, the election board came to the local high schools and registered the senior classes to vote as part of the civics classes. My registration was a big deal because I turned 18 on election day, and they had to make several phone calls to see if I would be eligible to vote that year.

Every six or so years, election day falls on my birthday, and it still reminds me of the first time I voted and began my journey as a person with a say in how the world operates.

There is a more significant way to have a say in how the world operates. We are followers of Jesus, who was sent by God the Father to live among us, teaching and preaching the Good News. Jesus gave us the great commandment; "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first

commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'" (Matt. 22:37-39)

The lives we lead as followers of Jesus are the most prominent way we affect this world. Our daily actions have as big an impact on the direction of our country as our civic duty to vote on its leaders.

Our choice to center our lives on a God who created us out of love, each and every one of us a beloved child of God, instills in us a sense of responsibility for our neighbors. Jesus tells us that after we love God first, we are to love our neighbors.

There is a parable where lawyers try to get Jesus to limit or define just who exactly our neighbors are. Jesus was having none of that. Our neighbors are just that. Everyone is our neighbor. The man in the business suit who owns his own company, the single mother struggling to make ends meet, the convicted felon, the drug addict, the homeless person, the person whose skin color is different than ours, the family with different values or traditions than ours. Everyone.

They are all our neighbors. We are called to love them as Jesus did. We are called to treat them just as Jesus would. That is how we change the face and direction of the world on a level that we can touch, taste, and feel.

Leaders are essential and necessary, but we all know there is a difference between things that happen 'over there' or 'on paper' and how we treat the people standing before us.

Change starts with us and works its way to the top. It begins with people who want to see their neighbors treated with respect, acceptance,

equality, and love. It starts with people who love their neighbors as themselves.

Religion and politics are very difficult and important topics to discuss and to try to separate. Preaching is not about being partisan, but it is political. It is about calling those who believe in Jesus to lead their lives in the best way they can as examples of the ideals that Jesus taught us.

Welcome all, heal the sick, clothe the naked, feed the hungry, visit the imprisoned, and spread the good news. Repeat daily.




WORSHIP SERVICES ONLINE


