Notes from the Pastor's Chair

Church is hard.

Church is hard for the prodigal soul returning home, broken and battered by the world.

Church is hard for the woman who looks like she has it all together, but doesn't.

Church is hard for the couple who fought the entire ride to service.

Church is hard for the single mom, surrounded by couples holding hands, and seemingly perfect families.

Church is hard for the widow and widower with no invitation to lunch after service.

Church is hard for the deacon with an estranged child

Church is hard for the choir member overwhelmed by the weight of the lyrics in that song.

Church is hard for the man insecure in his role as a leader.

Church is hard for the single adult praying God brings them a mate.

Church is hard for the teenager, wearing a scarlet letter, ashamed of their mistakes.

Church is hard for the sinners.

Church is hard for me.

It's hard because on the outside it all looks shiny and perfect. Sunday best in behavior and dress.

However, underneath those layers, you find a body of imperfect people, carnal souls, and selfish motives.

But, here is the beauty of church.

Church isn't a building, mentality, or expectation. Church is a group of sinners, saved by grace, living in fellowship as saints.

Church is a body of believers bound as brothers and sisters by an eternal love.

Church is a holy ground where sinners stand as equals before the Throne of Grace.

Church is a refuge for broken hearts and a training ground for mighty warriors.

Church is a converging of confrontation and invitation. Where sin is confronted and hearts are invited to seek restoration.

Church is a lesson in faith and trust.

Church is a bearer of burdens and a giver of hope. Church is a family. A family coming together, setting aside differences, forgetting past mistakes, rejoicing in the smallest of victories.

Church, the body, and the circle of sinners-turnedsaints, is where God resides, and if we ask, God is faithful to come.

So even on the hard days at church, the days when I am at odds with a sister or brother. When I've fought with my spouse because we're late once again. When I've walked in bearing burdens heavier than my heart can handle yet masking the pain with a smile on my face. When I've worn a scarlet letter, under the microscope. When I've longed for someone to hold or fought tears as the lyrics were sung. When I've walked back in, afraid and broken, after walking away. I'll remember, God has never failed to meet me there. This is a poem that I have printed on the inside of my work notebook. I came across it several years ago, and it found a special place in my heart. It found me when the church was not at its best, when the body of Christ struggled to know who and what it wanted to be.

This is still the case for today's church, which is an ever-evolving organism trying to find its footing in a new world. I vividly remember saying to my mentor that I had come too late. The church was not what I knew it to be. It was no longer what I remember from my childhood. This man looked at me and said, "You are right on time for the church. It will be hard and challenging. It will look and maybe even feel different than it did, but Jesus is there. You will guide your own flock of sheep through this next incarnation"

These words didn't feel like salve on my wounds at the time. They felt more like rubbing alcohol. But here I am with two flocks of sheep to lead. I bring this up because it is hard when things change. When the church doesn't look like it did before. When roles shuffle, and the hows are different. We as people don't like change. It upsets the apple cart of our daily lives, and for many, the response is to push back instead of leaning into it.


We started with the poem about how the church is hard. This has been hard since the days of Jesus and the disciples. Didn't Jesus go into the temple, turning over tables and throwing out money changers? This has been hard since the days of Paul, who lived, worked, and preached the Good News, establishing the Church throughout Asia Minor.

Do I miss the "church" I grew up in? Yes. But I miss every church that I have been a part of. There were wonderful aspects of all of them. I miss the mission style building of my first church with its low ceilings and dark beams. I miss kneeling rails during confession. I miss being a part of big bold singing congregations. Yes. I miss all those things that were church to me at some point. But I don't want to miss out on being church here. Change is hard. There have been some changes in the last couple of months. There is one newsletter now. We have one bulletin. And the administrative assistant position is now one position between both churches. It is not two positions. It is a seamless job between the two churches. The work flows back and forth seamlessly. Calvary and St Paul have been voked together since 2017 and one of the things that I was told when I was called was that it would be good if we worked together better. Having one newsletter and bulletin is a big step. Change for the sake of change is unnecessary but change as a way of making things better is worth exploring. We are all parts of Christ's body, and sometimes the body hurts a bit. But we take care of it together.



Did you know that St. Paul has a wonderful team of people who deliver Meals on Wheels in our community? This service enables the homebound to receive one hot meal and one cold meal each day Monday through Friday. St. Paul has one of the easiest routes as we deliver to about 20 individuals in four or five locations. We always work in pairs, and it only takes about an hour. St. Paul is responsible for one week's deliveries every four to six weeks. When we have enough volunteers, each set of partners is responsible for one day.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KITS AT ST. PAUL

Beginning the first Sunday in July, we will be collecting items to create School Kits which will be distributed through Lutheran World Relief. These kits are given to families affected by



ongoing conflicts and severe weather around the globe.

Education is one of the strongest tools a community has for breaking the cycle of poverty. Ensuring that all children, especially girls, can attend school in places where their access is not a priority has even stronger results. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children - and in some cases, adults – continue learning in the face of adversity. That learning leads to a better life, not only for them, but for their families and communities. There will be a

collection area in the narthex for your donations. Items will be collected through Sunday, September 8th. This is a great project that the entire congregation is invited to take part in!

The supplies needed for each kit are:

- (4) 70 sheet notebooks, wide or college ruled*
- (1) 12-inch ruler (with both inches and centimeters)
- (1) box of 16 or 24 count crayons
- (1) pencil sharpener
- (1) pair of blunt scissors
- (5) unsharpened No. 2 pencils with erasers.
- (5) black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- (1) 2 ½ inch eraser
- *Indicates the most needed item.


