Notes from the Pastor's Chair

It's September already, and it feels like this year is flying by way too fast. There is a song by Earth, Wind, and Fire that starts out, "Do you remember. The 21st night of September?" I hope so, because a lot of this year has gone by in a blur.

September in Wisconsin marks the beginning of Fall; here, the weather starts to change. The days and nights start to get cooler, and Lake Michigan shifts from looking inviting and refreshing to murky and cold. I realized the other day, while driving home along Memorial Drive, that I have grown and learned to judge the changes in the season by the appearance of the lake.

This got me thinking about how our faith life evolves as we live it out. When we are younger, we are taught stories like Jonah and the Whale, Noah and the Ark, or Daniel and the Lion's Den, and we hear them with amazement and wonder at the fantasy.

Then we grow and we hear them again, and questions arise about the how and why of them. We push and wonder about them, delving into what they mean for us and how we believe—stripping away some of the fantasy and myth to get at the more profound meaning.

Eventually, we quit hearing those stories, but we hear other stories, and they can still prompt us to delve deeper into their meaning for us, our lives, and the world. The Bible is about sustaining our faith journey. It is about learning where we stand with our own faith and providing us with the knowledge and courage to deepen and strengthen it.

Our faith in the words of Jesus and his teachings is what can effect change in the world. Our courage to step forward and believe that reaching out and interacting with those who are not like us or who don't believe like us can make a difference in the world for the better.

This is hard work. Work that takes tremendous effort on our part. Work that is not without risk. Belief and faith don't come without that, unfortunately—mature faith, September faith, so to speak, comes after a lot of growth.

As we roll into fall with fall with back to school, shorter days, colder weather, and changing leaves. Know that each of us is in a different place on our faith journey. Each of us has our own questions about belief, faith, and God. This is as it should be. We learn from each other as a community and fellow believers in Christ.

So, this September, keep asking yourself, "Are we caring for our neighbors as best we can? Keep remembering the teachings of Jesus about justice and equity for all and asking, "are our leaders looking for justice and equity for all." Keep remembering that Jesus welcomed everyone so ask yourself "are we and our community, country doing the same?"

Keep giving grace, mercy, and forgiveness to those around you as freely as Jesus gives it to us.

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope."
