# Notes from the Pastor's Chair

It's November, and this month, I start my third year of ministry at Calvary and St.
Paul. It's hard to believe that it's been two years already. Several people told me after I started that it didn't seem like I "just started" being a Pastor. I didn't know what to say because so much of what I do as your Pastor comes naturally.

Right after I was approved for ordination—the last step before graduation and starting the call process—my sister asked me earnestly what I did as a Pastor. I interned for a year and worked another year at that church. I had some ideas but not an accurate picture of what my days and weeks would look like. I had seen some of my mentors; work weeks and my internship supervisor's work, but it is different when you are in that chair.

So, what do I do? I preach forty-six Sundays a year. My letter of call states that I have four Sundays off for vacation and two Sundays off for continuing education. Due to the yoked nature of Calvary and St. Paul, there are two additional Sundays each on which I preach only at one church—adding special services like Lenten, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Christmas Eve, totaling 52 sermons a year. The prep work for sermons averages about ten to twelve hours a week between text study on Monday mornings, reading, studying, writing, and preparing.

I plan weekly worship so that Alyssa can prepare the bulletin and PowerPoint (Calvary). Planning worship entails picking the elements for the service and music. Approximately once every two months, Becky (Calvary's organist) and I meet to prepare for the next two months. For the last year, I have tried my best to pick hymns that both congregations know and recently started introducing some new ones. This planning is put onto a spreadsheet that Jeff (St. Paul's organist) can access for practice.

For the last year and until May of next year, I have been teaching confirmation to six of our youth at St. Paul. This is a learning experience for all of us. My internship was during COVID (mostly during the shutdown), and we had no confirmation kids with one family that kept the kids home until vaccines rolled out. Next November, we will be doing another First Communion class.

My call as your Pastor involves me engaging with the Synod. Our Synod has divided the churches geographically into conferences to minimize travel time and create smaller groups of colleagues. Calvary and St. Paul are in the Green Bay Conference, and I am the current President of this conference. Every month from September to May, we meet at various locations in the conference for fellowship, collegiality, and information. It is a time for Pastors to share concerns and seek advice from their peers. As a first-call Pastor, I am required to attend all First-Call events. This means monthly meetings (usually Zoom) and a Fall Retreat. These are times for those new to ministry to seek advice from our senior colleagues, gain educational experience, and have support.

There are church business meetings, council and finance meetings for both churches, periodic Joint Executive meetings, and various committee meetings. I know I have been told that I don't need to attend the committee meetings, but they help me understand what is happening in the church. They allow me to not just read the minutes but hear the discussion and get a sense of how people are feeling.

There are mandatory Synod training events such as Boundary or Racial training, Fall Theological Event, and Synod Assembly. For some pastors, being a part of a bigger Church is not important, but for me, it is. It is in our Creedal statements that we believe in an Apostolic church. We are part of something bigger than Calvary or St. Paul or the two combined. We are part of Christ's body, joined with the other churches in the East Central Synod of Wisconsin. Our synod with the others in Wisconsin and all the other synods across the nation and the world – we are part of the body of Christ.

As part of wanting to be involved in the bigger Church, I worked on the compensation committee with the synod. Currently, I am in a focus group on our healthcare offerings. These are things that I feel called to have a voice in as your Pastor who wants the church to adapt and change in the face of a culture that is not the same as it was five years ago, twenty years ago, or fifty years ago. The church has been ebbing and flowing, dying and regrowing since it began. I am part of the group of Pastors to help churches oversee it through this step.

Being a Pastor is much more than the things I have listed. Being your Pastor means I worry about how each of you is doing. How are you feeling? If you are struggling, can I do anything to help? When I was young, I spent most of my time around adults and learned they are reluctant to tell you how they are doing or if they are struggling and need help. Part of it is generational. Part of it is our American sense of independence. Part of it is our stoic ethnic roots.

Whatever the reason, as your Pastor, a good chunk of my week is spent worrying

about who I saw in church, who I didn't, whether I am doing enough to keep people coming in the doors, and whether I am the reason that they are not coming in the doors.

Another part of my work is preparing reports at the end of the year that include average attendance. I see the numbers and generally know the faces. People quietly step away, and being new, they have no relationship with me, so they are not responsive to my outreach. But I am left with a few question marks and no way to answer them.

I knew a lot about what ministry entailed before starting down this path. What has struck me the most is how this takes hold of your heart. Even in the short two years that I have been here, I have come to care for you all. I am still finding my way to do that. And I understand that I will never make everyone happy all the time. This is the happiest I have ever been in my career. After a lot of years of "just working" and wondering if I would ever find my calling in life, I did. My family and friends tell me that they see it in me. It may be heavy on my heart and soul. I may spend hours wrestling with questions that have no easy answers. But in the end, how my days are filled is a blessing.

WOW meets monthly at St. Paul for planning of events & fellowship. All women from Calvary & St. Paul are welcome to attend.






### FAITH CIRCLE AT ST. PAUL Tuesday, November 19 at 10am
