MEETING OF THE MOUNT PENN BOROUGH COUNCIL September 26, 2023

The Mount Penn Borough Council met in a Business Meeting on September 26, 2023. President Goodman brought the meeting to order at 7:30PM and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Responding to roll call were, President Troy Goodman and Council Members: Rick Lombardo, Roger Stief, Christine Dise and Michael Kindlick. Also in attendance were Mayor Ryan Maurer, Solicitor Tom Klonis, Engineer Ty Leinneweber, Christeena Hauck, and Crystal Johnson.

IV. AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION:

- A. St Lawrence Borough Councilmember's Mike Fritz and Warren Lubenow addressed Council regarding the grant for the shared garage. Mr. Fritz expressed St Lawrence Borough's willingness to move forward with the joint project and apologized for the time delay. Mr. Lubenow expressed his appreciation for the great cooperation between the two communities and his hope for that to continue. Discussion continued regarding the pros and cons of both sites for the proposed building, the joint municipal agreement that will need to be approved by both solicitors and staying on budget for the project. St Lawrence's solicitor will be compiling a list of talking points. A meeting with Mt Penn and St Lawrence Street Committees and both road crew staff will be held at St Lawrence Borough on Monday, October 16, 2023, at 6:30PM.
- B. Jennifer Lopez, 2413 Cumberland Ave expressed her frustration regarding Antietam School District's lack of respect for resident parking and asked for Councils help. The lot at 23rd and Perkiomen Ave was leased by the district for teacher/student parking. The lot is not being utilized by the teachers or students; they are parking on the streets of the community instead. She has been in touch with the superintendent who was unwilling to help and suggested she approached Council for permit parking.
- C. Billie Jean Buckland, 2318 Grant St also expressed concern regarding the school district paying \$18,000 to lease a lot containing 33 spaces that remain empty. She has been emailing the school board photos of the parking situation. She will share her timestamped photos with Council.
 - A letter will be sent from the Zoning Officer imploring the district to have the employees utilize the provided parking lot. The district has applied for Zoning relief. The hearing is scheduled for November 15, 2023. Mr. Klonis will also reach out to Attorney Bolland to inform him of the parking situation.
- D. Bill Howze, 1404 Friedensburg Rd asked Council to consider the school board a rogue board who are making decisions and taking actions without the proper steps. He implored Borough Council and Lower Alsace Board of Supervisors to stop the school board from destroying both communities with tax increases.

V. ENGINEERING-Ty Leinneweber

- 1. A letter from the Zoning Officer regarding the Special Exception of the School District was sent to Borough Council, the Zoning Hearing Board, Dr. Rochlin and Brian Bolland
- 2. 2451 Fairview Ave pool violation-the pool has been removed, however, the fence remains. Follow-up necessary.
- 3. The ADA ramp locations have been marked. Construction is set to begin on October 9, 2023. Tuan Doung made the motion for the Engineer to check the forms prior to the concrete being poured, seconded by Rick Lombardo. The motion carried unanimously. Intermittent inspections will be done by STE.
- 4. The CMS documents for the 2023 paving project are complete and have been approved by both the Engineer and the Solicitor.
- 5. The Local Share Accounts grant application needs to be submitted by 11/30/23. The project will be reconstruction of a few streets. Dave Okonski will meet with Ty Leinneweber to begin the application process. The residents will need to do their curbs prior to the street reconstruction as part of this project.
- 6. A list of questions was received from contractors for the trash bid.
