ORDINANCE NO. 775

**ORDINANCE # 775, AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT PENN,
BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING RULES AND
REGULATIONS FOR THE UTILIZATION OF DUMPSTERS AND OTHER
SIMILAR PORTABLE STORAGE CONTAINERS FOR THE DISPOSITION
AND STORAGE OF TRASH, BUILDING DEMOLITION, REFUSE
RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL FURNISHINGS, ETC.**

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Mount Penn, Berks County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby **ENACTED AND ORDAINED** by authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. That no individual, corporation or other legal entity or association shall place upon public or private property within the Borough of Mount Penn any dumpster, portable storage container or other similar container, whether permanent or temporary without first procuring a permit from the Borough of Mt. Penn.

SECTION 2. That Section 1. shall not be applicable to any business or entity, which in their normal business affairs uses a dumpster for the disposition of commercial waste accumulated with their business.

SECTION 3. The fee to obtain a permit for the use of a portable storage container or dumpster shall be as follows: Two Dollars (\$2.00) for one to three days. Five dollars (\$5.00) for four to seven days and an additional Five Dollars (\$5.00) each seven day period after the first seven days.

SECTION 4. That the location of any dumpster or other similar container within the Borough of Mt. Penn must be approved by an authorized representative of Borough Council, with due consideration for both vehicle and pedestrian traffic as well as the safety or persons and property. Including any property adjacent to the location on which the dumpster or other similar container is to be located.

SECTION 5. Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) together with costs of prosecution or to undergo imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days, provided: each violation of any provision of this ordinance each day the same is continued, shall be deemed a separate offense.
