Dear Parish Family,

How quickly time has past. It seems that not too long ago we began celebrating the season of Ordinary Time after the end of Christmas Season. Now Lent recently has begun and this Sunday is the Second Sunday of Lent.

As the Church celebrates the liturgical seasons, “Holy Mother Church believes that she should celebrate the saving work of her divine Spouse in a sacred commemoration on certain days throughout the course of the year...In the course of the year moreover, she unfolds the whole mystery of Christ... Thus recalling the mysteries of the redemption, she opens up to the faithful the riches of her Lord’s powers and merits, so that these are in some way made present at every age; the faithful lay hold of them and are filled with saving grace.” (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1163; *Sacrosanctum Concilium* 102)

Lent is a liturgical season for us, as Christians, to seek Christ’s mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, pray, fast and give alms, the latter of which includes continued growth in our practice of the Corporal Works of Mercy and Spiritual Works of Mercy (see list below to share with your family).

By the grace of God may all of our parish family have a blessed and fruitful Lent as we prepare, as members of the Body of Christ, to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of our Lord at the Paschal *Triduum* and by the grace of God be renewed as faithful holy disciples of Christ.
