#### Sacrament of Marriage:



#### Dear Parish Family,

The Lord is risen! Alleluia, alleluia! A few weeks ago, the Church celebrated Divine Mercy Sunday, the Second Sunday of the Octave of Easter. Lent often seems to last so long, especially when we are fasting and abstaining, as well as, growing in our practice of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. I am so thankful for the Church's celebration of Easter - the Resurrection of the Lord who is our joy, our hope. At last we are celebrating the Easter, the Paschal Mystery of the Resurrection of the Lord.

Please welcome and continue to pray for Jordan Nowacki who received the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter vigil Mass. As a new Catholic she is a new member of our parish family and also a member of the Communion of Saints.

On Divine Mercy Sunday, Bishop Schlert sent a pastoral letter which announced the beginning "the Year of the Real Presence, a Jubilee Year in the Diocese of Allentown, celebrating the 60th Anniversary of our founding in 1961 by Pope Saint John XXIII. On this date of that year, Most Reverend Joseph Mark McShea, First Bishop of Allentown, took possession of the Cathedral of Saint Catharine of Siena, and our diocesan life began."

Our bishop's letter encourages us in our Catholic to faith in that Jesus Christ is truly and really present, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, "In this Jubilee Year for our Diocese, we also will work to invite our parishioners to come back to Mass, to be really present before the Real Presence. As pandemic restrictions ease and a more routine life returns, so too will parish life need to recommence, beginning with the heart of parish life and the foundation of our Faith: worship of the Holy Eucharist at Sunday Mass... Since we cannot separate the Holy Eucharist from its worthy reception, the Sacrament of Penance, which prepares our souls to receive the Lord, must also be an emphasis in this Jubilee Year dedicated to Christ's Real Presence... There can be no Holy Eucharist without the Priesthood. Therefore, this Year of the Real Presence will be a privileged time.

During the Easter season our parish will have: 1. Exposition of the Eucharist for Eucharistic Adoration about 30 minutes before each scheduled weekday Mass. 2. Additional confession times after the scheduled Thursday evening Mass from 6:30 PM to 6:55 PM, first Fridays 5:30 PM to 6:00 PM, in addition to the regular confessions on Saturdays at 3:30 PM and by appointment.

3. Personal adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament is available whenever the church is scheduled to be open to the public.

May you and your family have a blessed Easter Season, Paschal celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord. He is risen indeed! Alleluia, alleluia!

#### Covid Guidelines: Modifications Effective May 1, 2021:

1. The faithful who attend Mass will be required to wear masks and maintain social distancing. Children under the age of 2 and those with medical exceptions are not required to wear a face mask.

Family groups may be seated together.

**2. Sunday Mass attendance will be limited to 80 people in the church proper (50% of the church seating capacity)** and 30 people in the lower church hall for the overflow Mass.

**3.** Sunday Mass attendees may enter the church using the ramp door only, 30 minutes before the scheduled Mass and exit using both ramp and front doors.

4. At the end of Mass, please exit the church using either the ramp door or the front doors.

## 5. The Distribution of Holy Communion is to return to the proper place in the liturgy. It is no longer permitted to distribute after Mass.

6. Holy Water: All fonts and stoops remain empty.

7. Votive Candles: Parishioners may now light votive candles. Please hand sanitize before and after lighting the candles.

**8. Hymnals and Devotional Kiosks:** Hymnals may be restored to the Church. Devotional materials and other pamphlets may be restored to their former locations.

9. Weekday Mass attendees may enter the church using the ramp door only, 30 minutes before the scheduled Mass.

10. Sunday 8:30 AM Mass will continue to be live-streamed for those unable to attend Mass.
